RECEIVED THEIR SENTENCES.

H. M. Stevens Gets Two Years and
John Brown Four Years.

This morning at 8 o'clock was fixed
for the time of sentencing Robert
Stevens, for burglary in Peters' store,
and John Brown, the villain who at-
tempted to rape several little girls.

Stevens was sentenced first. Prose-
cuting Attorney Brown made a state-
ment saying that this was the defend-
ant's first crime, that formerly he
stood high, was a young man and the
amount taken was small, hence he
would recommend that he receive the
lightest punishment—two years in the
penitentiary. Judge Fullerton carried
out the above recommendation, and
gave the defendant a sentence of two
years in the penitentiary.

In the case of John Brown, the Prose-
cuting Attorney described to the court
how the brute had upon three separate
occasions attempted the crime of rape
upon little girls and therefore thought
he should receive a severe sentence.
Judge Fullerton said he fully coincided
with the attorney of the state; that
this was one of the most heinous crimes
in law; therefore he adjudged that the
defendant should be confined in the
state penitentiary for the term of four
years.

Stevens and Brown were taken to
Salem on the local train this morning
by Sheriff A. J. Johnson and special
guard D. M. Drake.

known there as "Jack the Ripper."
