A Straight Business Proposition.

Mr. George T. Cline, of Woodburn, Oregon, who owns a traction freight engine of 40 horse power was in our city this week and has been induced to make the people of Eugene and vicinity a proposition, concerning transportation of freight between Eugene and Corvallis.

Mr. Cline will, if a sufficient amount of freight is pledged to justify the outlay, put in new bridges and repair the road and guarantee to haul one hundred tons of freight per month, if business demands it, at the stipulated price of \$2.75 per ton for the dry season of 1895 and \$2.50 for the dry season of 1896.

But in order to make himself safe in the large outlay it is necessary to fix the bridges and road and secure sufficient suitable wagons Mr. Cline requires that our citizens shall agree to furnish him 50 tons of freight per week at the above stipulated price for the seasons of 1895 and 1896.

Mr. Cline has examined the road and bridges and knowing the capacity of his engine, thinks the plan of traction freighting practical and of great value to the business of Eugene and the reduction in freight rates would save many thousand dollars to the shippers and consumers of Lane county.

Mr. Cline is morally and financially responsible and refers to the Bank of Woodburn as to his ability to carry out his part of the proposition. Mr. Cline would not ask a guarantee as to the volume of business and prices, were it not for the possibility that the railroad would probably cut price so much as to take the business and leave his outlay for the bridges and road repairs a dead loss.

The establishment of a freight line of this capacity and character would enable the business men of Eugene to make prices that would attract trade from a long distance. This proposition enables us to secure reasonable rates immediately and at no cost whatever to us.

Mr. Cline asks no bonus or help of any kind except that he shall have business enough to justify him the outlay mentioned above. Southeastern Oregon has a large cash trade that now goes to Ashland and other points along the S. P. railroad and we could secure permanently the rate on freight named above it would enable our business men to make prices that would attract nearly all of that trade to this point during the summer and fall months.

Mr. Cline says he can be ready to start his freight train within thirty days after the guarantees are furnished him. He has appointed Geo. M. Miller his agent to confer with business men and ascertain if his proposition is acceptable. This is a matter of great importance to our city and every one interested in the future growth of the city as well as those who wish to extend this trade should strain a point to encourage this enterprise.

Business men and all should consider this matter thoroughly and be prepared to give Mr. Cline and his agent a definite answer when called upon.

BOARD OF REGENTS.

A Committee Appointed to Reorganize the Faculty.—Improvements Agreed Upon.

Members present—Regents Henry Failing, of Portland, president; A. Bush, of Salem, S. Hamilton, of Roseburg, S. P. Sturgis, of Pendleton, L. L. McArthur, of Portland, T. G. Hendricks, A. G. Hovey and S. H. Friendly, of Eugene and Secretary J. J. Walton.

The following business of general importance was transacted: A resolution was passed that no professors should hereafter receive over \$2,000 per annum, and tutors not more than \$1,000.

A committee, consisting of Hons. L. L. McArthur, Henry Failing and S. P. Sturgis, was appointed to reorganize the literary, business and musical faculties.

Mrs. Watkins (the present matron of the dormitory, has been continued for the ensuing year. Next year the dormitory will be for the accommodations of male students only.

It was agreed that a gasoline plant be purchased to furnish light for the university buildings and the dormitory.

After considerable discussion the board resolved to place a gallery in Willard Hall.

Adjourned to meet in Portland July 23, to hear the committee appointed to reorganize the faculties and transact other business.
