Present: Mayor Matlock, Councilmen Fisher, Henderson, Eakin, Linn, Dunn and Bangs.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Finance committee reported favorably on several bills which were ordered paid.

Committee on streets reported arrangements for sprinkling Willamette street, also construction of Ninth street bridge. Report adopted.

Report referring to street and alley crossings read and adopted.

Report referring to sidewalks laid on the table.

Petition for arc light at intersection of Sixth and Oak streets, read and referred to committee on fire and water.

Petition for bridge near the new flour mill was read and motion made that the bridge be built by contract, the city to pay one-half of the expense, and the bridge to be the property of the mill company.

Ordinance to prohibit bicycles from running on sidewalks, read second time by title and referred to judiciary committee.

An ordinance requiring cutting and removing of grass from the streets and alleys by property owners, read three times and passed, and ordered published.

On motion Mr. Eakin was allowed \$4 rebate on certain taxes.

On motion one hose cart and hose were ordered removed to house of 11th street.

On motion it was ordered that the city pay \$2.50 per month part of rent for office for marshal.

Regular number of bills read and referred to finance committee.

Number of bills read, rules suspended and ordered paid.
