O. C. & E. RAILROAD EXTENSION.

The following from the Salem Statesman is a clear and succinct statement of the importance to a large portion of the Willamette valley, as well as the road, of an early extension of lines now under consideration by the Oregon Central and Eastern railroad:

"The present manager of the Oregon Central & Eastern railroad, Edwin Stone, is a practical Western railroad man and understands probably better than most men in such positions the actual needs of the territory he wishes to occupy; also the actual returns to a railroad from the occupancy of such territory. This fact gives stability and significance to Mr. Stone's movements and his recommendations to the company. He is known as one of the most expert accountants on the Pacific coast and figures have no mysteries he cannot solve, so that the 'profit and loss' of an enterprise reveals itself to him without any uncertainty.

"Mr. Stone has recommended to his company three enterprises, to wit: the early extension of the line from its present terminus eastward to Independence prairie, thus giving easy railroad connection to the people of Crook county; the early building of a branch line from Corvallis to Eugene; the building with similar expedition of a branch from some point in the Cascade foothills to Salem. A glance at the map of Oregon, backed by some knowledge of commercial influences, will at once reveal the importance of the system when completed in accordance with that plan.

"The extension and branches complete, and boats plying the Willamette river, would at once place the Oregon Central & Eastern railroad in a position to compete for the carrying trade of the whole valley. The immense section of rich farming country east and southeast of Salem would be tributary to the Salem-Cascade branch; the south end of Benton county and a portion of Lane would be the exclusive field of the Corvallis-Eugene branch, while a large portion of Lane county would patronize it by choice under present conditions. The extension to Independence prairie would naturally divert the Crook county trade which now passes from The Dalles. These things taken in connection with the immense timber interests along the road in both mountain ranges, but especially in the Cascades, the prosperous mining interest that are now in process of development in Eastern Linn and Marion counties would insure to that road a profitable business from the moment rolling stock should be set in motion thereon.

"It is claimed by the friends of the Oregon Central & Eastern that with ocean transportation to San Francisco they can carry freight at rates that would be ruinous to the Southern Pacific, hence they could offer inducements to shippers of Oregon products at this end and of merchandise at the other that would force patronage as a matter of dollars and cents.

"It can thus be seen that there is nothing chimerical in the talk of these branch lines, but they are necessities to the better prosperity of the railroad. While that is the

case, they are a still greater necessities to the localities in which they are to be built. Salem, for instance, ought to be alive to the importance of hastening her branch to the Cascades, and so should every farmer in the territory tributary to it. There is yet time during 1895 to build a railroad to Stayton, Mehama or Mill City, because work can be pushed on such a line during the entire season. It is probable, Mr. Hammond and Mr. Stone may come to Salem in the near future to consult its people in regard to that branch. The business men of Salem ought to be ready to talk to them in accordance with some plan and with some unanimity of sentiment. To this end, would it not be wise to have a meeting, either under the auspices of the board of trade or by some other authority, and have the proper committees appointed to meet these gentlemen and ascertain what is necessary to be done?"

The remarks in the last paragraph apply equally well to Eugene, and nearly every portion of Lane county. At the rates given by that railroad farmers and business men from nearly every portion of the county could afford to haul produce and merchandise, to and from their stations.

For the past two seasons we have had an object lesson. Large quantities of freight have been hauled by team from Corvallis to Eugene, a distance of 40 miles, at a considerable saving besides giving teamsters employment. With a branch line to Eugene business men of Cottage Grove, Creswell, Springfield, Dexter, Pleasant Hill, Coburg, and nearly every other trading point in the county, except those to the north along the line, could make money using teams hauling to and from the O. C. & E. line.
