The circuit court has too many foreclosure suits to be encouraging. Many are not able to pay debts which were contracted during an era of fair prices. The debts increase while prices decrease. The people are paying dearly for silver demonization which decreased the available stock of the worlds money one-half. Dear gold, cheap everything else. Facts.

A ride about the country several miles around Eugene will convince one that the fruit industry will soon become one of great importance to our people. Young orchards have been planted on every side, some of them already in bearing. Most of them have been cultivated and cared for, but some are neglected and plainly show the result. The orchardist cannot expect to be successful without proper and intelligent cultivation.

The circuit court of Marion county did a good job when the jury found the manager of the Albany Red Crown mills guilty of stealing wheat deposited therein. When the mill shut down there was hardly enough grain or millstuff in it to feed a cow over night yet there were receipts out for about 20,000 bushels. It is not possible that the manager was unaware of the fact that he was grinding and disposing of wheat that did not belong to him. A few convictions in such cases would deter unprincipled warehouse and mill men from using wheat which does not belong to them.

John Sherman has written a book giving his recollections of forty years at Washington as a representative, senator and member of the cabinet. According to a telegraphic review of the book the senator airs considerable republican dirty linen, and as many public men who participated in the events narrated are yet alive, adverse criticism and denial will result. It reads like the work of a petulant old man across whose life the shades of a second childhood are beginning to fall. The book in the main is laudatory of Sherman's financial policy. A large number of our people are firmly convinced that the ills that now beset us may be attributed in part to the Ohio political aristocrat. He forgets to inform the public how he became a millionaire off a salary that barely suffices to support public men of any prominence who enter congress.

The political end of the Oregonian occasionally indulges in dismal tales as to the injury to our lumber interests by reason of repeal of a pro-

ective tariff. The business end of the concern, however, which gives news and facts, tells right along how Pacific coast mills are shipping lumber to foreign ports. Only yesterday it had a report of ten leading Puget Sound mills shipping during the month of September, in round numbers, 10,000,000 feet of lumber to foreign parts against 19,000,000 shipped to domestic ports. A ten year old boy who cannot see that an industry that can send its productions abroad needs no protection should be whipped into reason by that Portland public school teacher who raises welts and draws blood. The only effect a tariff could have in such a case, would be to allow mill owners to combine so as to rob domestic purchasers to the extent of the so-called protection.

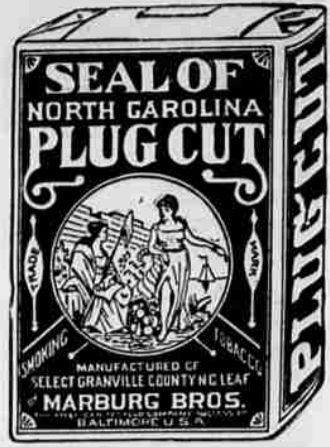
