A Crowd of Lawyers.

The following attorneys were before Referee Woodcock after slices in that \$100,000, according to a list made out by the Statesman:

J R Bryson and W S McFadden, of Corvallis, represented the trustee of the road, the Farmers' Loan & Trust company and its attorneys; W S Huford, county judge, Benton county in its claim for taxes; Joseph H Wilson, of Corvallis, assisted Judge Huford and had some other claims; J R Wyatt, of Albany, represented Lincoln county in its claim for taxes; Wallace Nash represented T E Hogg, receiver of the road, and holders of receivers' certificates; E E Wilson, of Corvallis, represented the school district embracing Corvallis in its claim for school taxes; A L McFadden, of Corvallis, represented the holders of receivers' certificates who furnished the money which was ordered paid by the court to the employees of the road when payment to the amount of 48 per cent was made; Judge John Burnett, of Corvallis, represented his own claims and those of L Flinn, of Albany; County Judge J N Duncan, of Albany, represented Linn county's claim for taxes; Geo G Bingham, of Salem, represented Marion county's claim for taxes and the claims of 75 laborers. All the foregoing were present in person. Snow & McCamant, of Portland, represented with briefs the insurance companies' claims on certificates; W D Fenton, of Portland, represented the claims of his firm, Bronaugh, Fenton & McArthur, for attorney's fees.

Judge Woodcock will aim to return his findings and decision by January 23d, at which time circuit court will convene in Benton county.

PORTLAND, Dec. 13.—The assessment roll was completed last night and the total amount of taxable property in Multnomah county is placed at \$55,000,000.

[Last year the return by the county board placed the total amount at \$51,315,330. This was equalized by the state board of equalization to \$55,260,552.]
