ON THE RIVER.—The steamer Hong arrived yesterday morning with about 45 tons of freight, about 25 tons of which was for Eugene and the balance south. She unloaded and left down early in the afternoon with four tons of leather. In coming up she swung against the bridge near Harrisburg, tearing off a part of the side but doing no serious damage. The Gypsy arrived up this afternoon with about 20 tons of miscellaneous freight, about 20 tons for Eugene and the balance for points south, part of the cargo being 200 sacks of sugar for Grants Pass. She will take down with her about 10 tons of freight, mostly produce. The cold weather is having the effect of lowering the water in the river, it now being down to a little less than 5 feet.

THE TAX LEVY MADE.

The Levy for 1895 is Fixed at 17 Mills. The county court this afternoon made the tax levy for 1895, fixing the rate at 17 mills. This is 2 mills higher than last year. The state levy this year is one and eight-tenths mills higher than last year, so the raise in this county is but two-tenths of a mill. The reason for the raise in the levy for the county is that the expenses of two elections will have to be met, and the amount of taxable property is less. Last year the net taxable property was \$9,555,393, and this year it is \$9,411,433, or \$143,960 less. Last year the levy included one-twentieth of a mill for indigent soldiers, but this year the levy does not include anything for that purpose, as there is enough in that fund left over.

The levy for this year is as follows: State..... 4.5 mills School..... 5.2 mills County..... 7 mills

The funeral services were conducted at the family residence at 3 o'clock this afternoon, and the remains were laid to rest in the Odd Fellows' cemetery.
