BOX FACTORY.—The Eugene Mill and Lumber Company is erecting an addition to their mill in this city in which will be placed the machinery of the company's box factory. The addition is 28x50 feet in size. The company did considerable business in the box line last season and expect to do much more this season. The machinery last year occupied the basement of the mill, but as they were crowded for room and expect to add some more machinery to their plant this spring a new building was necessary. The timber used in making boxes, which are used for packing fruit, is white fir and balsam. The first named is used principally, as it is much easier to work into boxes. Both these timbers make fine fruit boxes and leave the fruit free from any taste of the wood after it has been removed from the box.
