TURNPIKE TO JUNCTION.—At the May session of the commissioners' court a petition was presented by F. L. Chambers of this city and 48 others praying for the establishment of a turnpike road between this city and Junction. Beginning at the city limits of Eugene the road known as the "River road," extending through road districts No 27, 31, 37 and 42, is to be graded and graveled to a point about one mile north of Junction. The improvement is to be made this summer with the first available work in the districts through which the road passes. The petition has been granted by the court. When this work is completed it will make a fine thoroughfare between this city and Junction, which will be in good condition at all seasons of the year.
