One of the evidences of prosperity in Eugene following McKinley's election is a reduction in the size of the Register by the discontinuation of a supplement.

The present old shack in Eugene, by courtesy called an opera house, should be condemned by the city council at its next meeting. It is a menace to life every time a gathering is held within its four walls.

At two o'clock on Wednesday, November 4, the sales of the New York Journal for that morning had reached 958,991, and of the German edition 83,893. This is the highest watermark ever reached by a New York daily.

The Iowa savings bank of Sioux city, Ia., closed its doors last week, on account of heavy withdrawals on deposits and inability to realize on securities. The Paul Mill Co. of Menash, Wis., has also made an assignment. Are these signs of returning prosperity?

The democracy of Omaha have little in common with those so-called democrats who bolted the Chicago ticket. The Jacksonian club of Nebraska, a pioneer democratic organization, at a recent meeting, ordered the pictures of secretaries Morton and Carlisle removed from the walls of its club-rooms, and struck from its rolls the names of secretary Morton, Col. John P. Irish, of California; Tobias Castor, ex-national committeeman; James Woolworth, president of the American Bar Association, and about 40 others, for what the resolution recited as "active and open opposition to the regular democratic nominees, and aiding the election of the republican candidates."

It has been decided by the post-office department to experiment in the way of a rural free delivery of mail. Under the authority of congress the postoffice department will establish, as rapidly as possible, a free rural delivery in 30 counties scattered throughout the country. The intention is to deliver mail by mounted carriers to farmers residing within a radius of three and one-half miles from the city limits. There has been considerable discussion as to the practicability of the scheme. In the East, where the farming districts are thickly settled and the roads good, the plan is practicable and it would be a much appreciated convenience to the farmers; but, as this new system would be quite costly and here in the West our postal service being badly crippled by the lack of means to carry on the service, it would seem best to wait until all the country offices were supplied with a daily mail service before this free delivery scheme is put into effect.

Discussing the Branch Asylum decision, the Union Republican says: The Salem hog is already

laying plans to bleed the people farther in building up its town at the State's expense. It wants asylums and schools built there for idiots, morphine fiends, inebriates, feeble minded and those overtaken by poverty and physical debility. Salem don't care for expense so long as the state pays the bills. But the legislature should make no appropriations for more permanent institutions there until the matter of changing the constitution can be submitted to the peo
