THE PLAIND DEALER SALE.—Roseburg
Review: The reported negotiations
for the sale of the Plaindealer, news-
paper, to Railroad Commissioner J. B.
Eddy, are not off entirely, so it is said,
but there is a hitch involving about
\$400 that is causing trouble. The
heavy indebtedness of the plant makes
the negotiation for the transfer of own-
ership more difficult than it otherwise
might be, and the final consummation
is not at all certain. So anxious are
prominent republicans to get Mr. Ben-
jamin out that a subscription paper is
being circulated to raise this \$400, one
leader being down for \$50 and others
for smaller amounts. There are good
reasons to believe Mr. Eddy will con-
duct the paper in the interest of the
anti-Hermann faction if he secures
control of it—the same faction of the
party that carried the republican pri-
maries in Roseburg last spring.

The Bimetallic sheriff, county clerk
and recorder, in Yamhill county, are
paying their own deputies. This is
the result of the success of the Union
Bimetallic ticket in Yamhill county.
The county officers of Clackamas and
Linn counties are doing the same and
it will be a saving of several thousand
dollars to the taxpayers of these coun-
ties.
