WHAT LINCOLN WROTE McCLELLAN.

"What the senate committee on foreign relations has practically said to Mr Cleveland in regard to the Cuban situation said a prominent Western senator recently to a representative of the Washington Post, 'reminds me of what President Lincoln wrote to General McClellan, when he was in command of the army. General McClellan, as is well known, conducted a waiting campaign, being so careful not to make any mistakes that he made very little headway. President Lincoln sent this brief but very pertinent letter:
'My dear McClellan: If you don't want to use the army, I should like to borrow it for awhile. Respectfully, A. LINCOLN.'"

Salem Journal: Senator McClellan of Lane county will this year bring up the bill introduced by Representative Moorhead in the last house providing for a verdict by two thirds of the jury in civil actions. The bill passed the house in 1895, but died in the hands of the senate committee to which it was referred.

It has done about all it could, both editorially and through correspondents, to array the gold standard forces against him, and now has taken a new thread by urging the democratic and populist members of the legislature to hold out against him. And it cannot be denied that there are sufficient reasons why they should give him their support, since if he is insincere in supporting the St. Louis platform, they had as well support J. N. Dolph or W. H. Corbett, so far as the money question is concerned.

If any person imagines that President McKinley has no sense of humor he should read the following which he sent to the editor of a woman's edition of a Binghamton, N.
