THE CRAIG CASE.—Today's Oregonian: The United States grand jury, which has been session for the past nine days, appeared in court yesterday afternoon and reported not a true bill in the case of T J Craig, formerly postmaster at Eugene. Craig was charged with embezzling government funds, there being a shortage in his accounts of some \$500. As it was found that this shortage was not due to any criminal intent, but was largely the result of a loose way of doing business, and as Mr Craig's bondsmen had made good the amount, the grand jury decided to return not a true bill.
