BODY SNATCHING.

Oregon has been remarkably free from the crime of body snatching. The rifling of the Ladd tomb and carrying away the remains of the dead millionaire is a business proposition for the perpetrators of the uncanny deed. They expect a rich reward and are more likely to get it than to be subjected to the punishment allotted to the crime, the maximum penalty of which three years imprisonment in the penitentiary. Grave robbing is a serious offense, especially when committed with intent to commit a crime and obtain a reward. It is only excusable when necessity compels medical colleges to secure cadavers for purposes of dissection and practical instruction in the make up of the human body. While against the law, its violation for this purpose is winked at, and it is seldom any trouble. The men who rob graves in hope of reward for return of the remains deserve good long terms in the penitentiary. It does not look possible that the perpetrators of a scheme like this, where several persons must have been engaged, can long escape detection. The only thing that would thwart justice would be the anxiety of the relatives of the dead man to secure the remains without further notoriety.

DEAR GOLD—CHEAP LABOR.

The silver question is the storm center in the great battle for monetary reform, that is now being waged. Against silver, the bondholders and money and credit mongers of the two continents have made common cause. Against it are arrayed the owners of the indebtedness of the world, an amount exceeding \$150,000,000,000. They favor the gold standard because it means scarce and dear money. Every fall in the general level of prices means that they are correspondingly enriched at the expense of society.

Dear gold on one hand; cheaper labor and products of labor on the other. Can the masses be much longer hoodwinked into support of the single gold standard?

If there are any veteran soldiers who are deserving of pensions it is that surviving body of Indian war veterans which fought the pioneer battles of our western commonwealth.
