BLAIR HOUSE BURNED.

One of the Land Marks of the Willamette Valley - Built in '54.

At about 11 o'clock last night an alarm was turned in and the department without loss of time started for the western end of town, where the sky was rapidly taking on a lurid hue. Before they had proceeded far however it was ascertained that the fire was consuming the old house on the donation land claim of Prior Blair about one mile out, rendering the assistance of the department of no avail, and the apparatus was returned to their respective headquarters and housed.

The loss was a complete one, not a vestige of the old building remaining and the chimney which remained standing during the night, crumbled and fell to earth this morning. The house was built in '54 and in early days was probably the best known house in the valley. The upper story of the house was used as a dance hall then, and it is said 140 couples have danced on the floor at once, which was 20x40 feet in size.

The house has been occupied by a family by the name of Vance, but they had moved out that morning, Mr Vance taking the belongings to his ranch near Cottage Grove and his wife and daughter went on the early excursion train to Salem, intending to visit Portland before returning. It is something of a mystery how the building caught fire the general impression being that the family had left some fire smoldering or that hobos had occupied the house during the evening.

The building was insured in the Norwich Union for \$500 in the name of Mrs James McClaren, the owner, and the loss is estimated at about \$1000. The building originally cost \$3500.
