WAR WILL AID SILVER.

Mr Bland Sees Hope for the White Metal in the Trouble With Spain.

Representative Bland, of Missouri, leader of the silver forces in the house believes the war with Spain a godsend to the silver cause. "I look for a big victory at the polls," said he. "The attempt of the Republican party to make political capital out of this war will prove futile. "I have seen it stated that war with Spain means the death of the silver issue. Any one with the ordinary allotment of intelligence can see silver will be the winner by this conflict. When we increase our outstanding debt and further obligations are incurred by the government it will be necessary to increase the volume of money. This can only be done by the coinage of the silver seigniorage in the treasury or the authorization of a further purchase of silver bullion. Congress alone has the power to purchase additional silver and to coin the seigniorage. "The amendment proposed to the revenue bill by Senator Wolcott, directing the Secretary of the Treasury to coin the seigniorage in the Treasury, will pass the senate without serious opposition. When it comes to the House I shall make a fight to have it retained in the bill. The seigniorage now in the Treasury amounts to about \$42,600,000, while the total amount of seigniorage is about \$127,000,000. To my mind it is necessary the seigniorage should be coined. "I hope also to see the bond provision in the revenue bill defeated and shall do everything in my power to accomplish it."

President Faure, at the unveiling of the monument to the combatants of 1870, at St Etienne, declared that France was resolved to maintain the strictest neutrality, and he said he earnestly hoped that the efforts of the neutral powers would succeed in restoring peace.

Governor Black has decided to call an extra session of the New York legislature to deal with Tammany, to make additional appropriations for war expenses, and to provide for the soldiers voting if they are kept in the field until November.

War came at a very opportune moment for the gold ticket in Oregon.

The Universal Peace Union, through its president, Alfred H Love has prepared and mailed to the Queen Regent of Spain and Premier Sagasta an appeal asking that government to acknowledge the independence of Cuba in the interests of peace.

An official denial has been issued of the rumors of the occupation, cession, or sale of any Spanish territory to France, and it is also denied that the latter intends to occupy territory in Mexico.

The British government understands business. It has sent a friendly protest to Spain with respect to the latter's strengthening of the fortifications opposite Gibraltar.
