BOHEMIA CAMP.

A Larger Working Force at Present Than Ever Before.

Each Day Sees a New Vein Opened.

The Bohemia Mining Camp is fast coming into prominence as one of the best camps on the coast. Being only one day's drive from Eugene, it is easy to reach at any time during the year. A good wagon road will be finished right into the center of the camp within the next few weeks. It only lacks about 2 1/2 miles of being completed at the present time. The mines are all strictly quartz mines and rich strikes are being made every few days. The latest being made last week by B E Hawley & Co in the Wall Street mine. At a depth of 4 feet they struck a vein 8 inches wide of high grade galena ore and by the side of this a 10 inch vein of very free milling ore. The samples showing the free gold very conspicuously. Some pieces being literally covered with it and easily perceptible to the naked eye at a distance of twenty feet. They have sent a sack of the ore to be assayed. In sending the ore to be assayed they do not pick out special specimens, but take a general average of it all.

Sounds of blasting are heard in all directions. Messrs Gover & Knapp have commenced opening up a tunnel on the White Swan mine and the ore is proving richer than at first supposed. Two road crews are at work—three or four wood camps are in full blast—one party is burning 2000 bushels of charcoal. A saw mill will be running about July 1st on City creek just below the Music mine.

General Shafter at Santiago De Cuba.

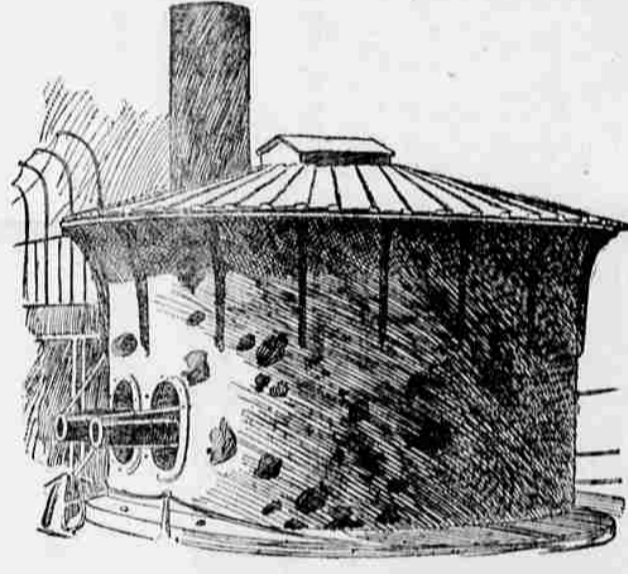
Leave Saturday for Philippines.

OREGON OFFICIAL ROSTER
 Every Patriotic Citizen Should Possess One of Them
 Mrs Amelia de F Smith has compiled and published the official roster of the Second Regiment, Oregon Volunteers, now at Manila, Philippine Islands. It is illustrated with the photographs of all the officers of the regiment, including Gov Lord, Lt Col Geo O'Voran, Captain Moon and Lieutenant Houston. Besides a large number of views of camp life, brief military biographies are given of each officer.
 Perhaps the feature of the souvenir of greatest interest is the reproduction of the autograph of every officer and private in the regiment. There are over 1000 names in this roster.
 The work concludes with a history of the Oregon emergency corps, names of officers, committees and members.
 The book is a souvenir of the stirring times of 1898 that no patriotic citizen of Eugene, or Oregon for that matter, should be without.
