Impelled by some horrible irresistible fascination he returns to the scene of the murder and behold! the winds of heaven have scattered the leafy covering, and exposed the body to sight.

The murderer carefully removes the telltale object, secures weights to it, then seeks the aid of a neighboring pond in which to hide the mute evidence of his crime. After a time he is again drawn, as if by a chain of iron, to look upon the scene where the body reposes. The waters have dried up, and again a senseless corpse appeals for justice against the murderer.

A stern minion of the law marches the offender against man and God to the prison where he pays the penalty of his crime. Was it that same feeling of unrest, perhaps a fascination, that held Claude Branton to the vicinity of the murder, where he is well known, when he might have effectually covered his tracks and escaped to some far country?

BRYAN ON IMMORTALITY. The following tribute to the soul's immortality by W J Bryan is a part of an eulogy on the death of a friend. It is a gem, and is fit to adorn your scrap book.

"If the Father deigns to touch with divine power the cold and pulseless heart of the buried acoer, and make it burst forth from its prison walls, will he leave negligent the soul of man who was made in the image of his Creator? If He stoops to give the rose bush, whose withered blossoms float upon the autumn breeze, the sweet assurance of another spring time, will He withhold the words of hope from the soul of man when the frosts of winter come? If matter, mute and inanimate, though changed by the forces of nature into multitude of forms, can never die, will the spirit of man suffer annihilation after it has paid a brief visit, like a royal guest, to this tenement of clay? Rather let us believe that He who

in his apparent prodigality wastes not the rain drop, the blade of grass or the evening's singing sparrow, but make them all to carry out His eternal plans, has given immortality to the moral, and gathered to Himself the generous spirit of our friend."

"OLD GLORY"

Charles Sumner's tribute to the Stars and Stripes is good and appropriate reading just now:

"Here is the National flag! He must be cold in bed, who can look upon its folds rippling in the breeze without pride of country. It is a piece of bunting lifted in the air, but it speaks sublimely, and every part has a voice. Its stripes of alternated and white proclaim the original union of the thirteen states to maintain the Declaration of Independence. Its stars of white on a field of blue, proclaim that union of states constituting our national constellation, which resolves a new star with every state. The two together signify union, past and present. The very colors have a language, which was recognized by our fathers. White is for purity; red for valor; blue for justice; and all together, bunting, stripes, stars and color, blazing in the sky, make the flag of our country to be cherished by all our hearts, to be upheld by all our hands."
