GOOD ROAD SENSE. The Dallas Itinerary compliments a road supervisor of Polk county, and gives his views on the proper way to build roads. It says: "He believes it would be economy to make fills where many bridges and culverts now exist. He says that within the last three years he has put fills where there were ten bridges containing 30,000 feet of lumber. Most of the bridges were below the level of the road but the fills were made the full width of the grade and up to the level of the road."

That is good sound road building sense, and if generally adopted would save many dollars annually to the taxpayers. In years past in Lane county it has not been an unusual thing for a road supervisor to take more time to haul a few planks to make a short bridge than would have been consumed in filling the depression. Fills should be made wherever possible. The Lane county court so instructs its supervisors. Farther, when the necessary work is beyond the means in the supervisor's hands, the court is willing to assist, taking the view that it is far cheaper to expend money on filling with brush and dirt rather than for the more expensive lumber.

Coquille City Bulletin: According to the Oregonian, the next senator for California, will be rich man. To use its exact words: "Of course, when rich men want things in California, no matter what, nobody else has a chance." The paper further says that qualification is barred, and from start to finish the case will be a "coin fight." Indeed, can California be so corrupt? If so we can see nothing that could restrain the more respectable class of our golden state neighbors from moving over into Oregon, where all conditions are worthy of the fittest.

Spain cannot do otherwise than surrender the Philippines. She cannot fight longer—has nothing with which to fight. We have "remembered the Maine," now it is Spain's time.
