ROYALTY IN THE SADDLE.

The recent falls from horseback of Emperor William of Germany and of the Duke of Connaught, serve to call attention to the fact that whatever equestrianism there is among the reigning families of Europe seems to be restricted to the ladies. All the sons of Queen Victoria ride ungracefully and are indebted to a Hessian of the name of Meyer, of Darmstadt, for their German seat in the saddle.

King Humbert has been thrown off his horse more often than any other royal personage in Christendom. The late czar was a bad rider and it was some uncomplimentary comment in relation to his riding made by Emperor William, and carefully repeated at the court of St. Petersburg, which was the origin of no end of bitterness between the two monarchs. The obesity of the king at Portugal renders him awkward on horseback. The king of Sweden and his sons are all indifferent horsemen, as is also the present czar, while King George of Greece and his father, King Christian of Denmark, prefer walking to every kind of exercise.

THE WHITE NAVY.

The work of painting the war vessels in the Brooklyn navy-yard white, the usual color in times of peace, has been begun. A force of men is now engaged in repainting the Indiana, Massachusetts and Chicago, and the lead color of those vessels, which was adopted during the recent war as being less conspicuous than white, and better adapted for active service, is fast disappearing.

The work will also be carried on at Hampton Roads, where vessels of the North Atlantic squadron are now assembling.

MORE MONEY FOR FARMERS.

On the basis of the farm prices December 1, the agricultural department's figures place the 1898 crops of corn and oats as worth \$83,000,000 more than the crops of 1897. Statistician Hyde accredits this largely to the difference in prices. The corn crop is a trifle larger than in 1897, and the average price per bushel is 2 1/2 cents higher, while the oat crop is similarly a little larger than in 1897, and the price is 4 1/2 cents higher.

The annual report of Binger Hermann, commissioner of the general land office, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1898, shows that the total area of land surface in Oregon is 61,626,218 acres, of which 35,897,869 are unappropriated and unreserved, 24,095,763 acres being surveyed and 11,802,106 unsurveyed. The area reserved is 5,467,702; appropriated, 20,260,447. Of the 35,897,869 acres of unsurveyed and unappropriated lands, 17,067,000 acres are desert and grazing lands, and 18,830,869 woodland and forest. None of it is mentioned as barren, irreclaimable wastes. The estimated water supply of the state is 3,000,000 acres. During the year 18 mineral and mill site patents for land in Oregon were issued, and 57,888.59 acres were certified or patented on account of railroad grants. The swamp land selections approved aggregated 1,791.74 acres, and those patented 2,190.21. Since the dates of the grants, 222,567.93 acres have been patented. The selection of 73,695 acres of school and indemnity lands by the state was approved. This estimated acres of forest reservations in Oregon are as follows: Bull Run, 142,080 acres; Cascade, 4,402,800 acres; Ashland, 18,500.

Telegram: The death of William Black, the novelist, removes from the world of fiction-writers one of the most popular and prolific of his time. He ranked with the most scholarly light English novelists, and was a great favorite with the American reading public. He began his career as a newspaper writer, which cultivated his superior talent as a student, and word painter of human nature.

William P. Lynn, brother-in-law of Iglesias, president of Costa Rica, who came to this country with the latter, is under arrest in New York. He is charged by F. S. Lusk, of Lusk, Wyo., with failing to account to him for profits on a Costa Rican railroad scheme, involving about \$1,000,000. Lynn is not a small man by any means.

Father Sherman writing from Porto Rico, says: "Porto Rico is a Catholic country without religion—that is to say, there is little practical Catholicism here, and no other pretended religion whatsoever."
