Dr. Josephi, state senator elect from Multnomah, has prepared a bill for better regulation of the insane asylum. A leading feature of the bill provides for a board of six trustees two of whom at least must visit the asylum not less than once each month. They shall be privileged to talk with any patient or visit any part of the asylum without being accompanied by any asylum employee. Letters to them from patients shall be delivered without inspection by the asylum authorities.

Dr. Josephi had charge of the Oregon insane for many years and is aware that abuses can easily become fastened upon such an institution where employees run to the thousand. Employees cannot but become callous in dealing with such a body of insane, and it is Dr. Josephi's idea that a disinterested unbiased board shall hear and determine complaints. After all, though, they could but listen to the statements of the superintendent and his employees. Dr. Josephi must know that the insane are unreliable, and crafty to the degree that it often requires the nicest discrimination to tell where reason ends and insanity begins.

GOLD IN THE TREASURY.

The daily statement of the treasury for January 5th shows an available cash balance of \$290,727,045. Nearly \$5.00 for every man, woman and child in the country stowed away where it does no good! The retiring of that vast sum from circulation certainly does harm. It is the gold standard policy that claims that the treasury must have coin enough to meet possible demands by presentation of green-back, and treasury notes for redemption. Yet the paper money is preferred to gold, and no one demands gold for paper. That paper circulated at par without question before there was ever a dollar of reserve in the treasury.

Every action of the treasury is in the direction of riveting the gold standard more firmly on the people. The constant accumulation and accretion to this vast reserve, that comprises nearly one-fourth of our available circulating medium, of all kinds, cannot but be a menace to business and fix the con-

trol of the finances of the country in the grasp of financial magnates. The government is in partnership with them instead of representing the people.

ATLIN LAKE WON'T FREEZE.

Atlin City is a typical Alaska boom town. Some interesting notes about winter life there as well as the latest news is contained in the Skagway-Atlin Budget. It says: "Atlin lake is the only unsolved problem here. The people have been waiting for it to freeze, but it has not frozen. The waves still reveal seemingly in their last days of freedom from binding ice floes; and elish sometimes appears but the temperature of the water still remains at 35 deg. The mercury may drop to 10 below zero, but it only makes the lake smoke and steam off vapor in clouds, and the damp fog freezes on all the landscapes, making the hundred miles of Atlin's valley a crystal fairland, but a beauty, though that is wasted unnoticed on this busy community; for every one here is bent on booming the country, building cabins, hauling supplies and digging for gold."

The old backneyed cry, that has done duty for the gold combination during the past twenty years, that silver as an issue in our politics is dead, has been revived of late by the gold press and politicians of the country. But this time the tremulous voice and feeble notes, of those who proclaim silver a dead issue, portray the doubts and fears that harass them, and suggest to the mind the boy who when going through a graveyard whistled to keep up his courage.

Thermometers show that the temperature on the bridges across the Willamette at Portland is about five degrees warmer than on land, although the people feel the cold in crossing more keenly than on land. The free sweep of wind accounts for the seeming decreased temperature.
