THE LEGISLATURE

A Number of Important Measures Acted Upon Today.

ADJOURNED UNTIL MONDAY.

STATE HOUSE, SALEM, Jan 13—Measures were introduced in the House today to pay the bill of Rosanna Lancaster or her four thousand dollars. She is the widow of Columbia Lancaster, Supreme Judge of Oregon Territory in 1849.

Representative Flagg, of Marion county has introduced a temperance bill which provides that saloon keepers petitioning for license must secure a majority of the bona fide electors in the precinct before a license is granted.

Governor Geer's message accompanying report of the Agricultural College, at Corvallis, thanking the legislature for appropriation, and presenting needs of the institution in the future. And rendered in replacing Mechanical Hall is fully adequate.

Bill has been introduced disallowing the sale of Denny pheasants, excepting alive, for four years.

Memorial to congress in regard to the justice of the claims of the Indian war veterans was adopted by the House.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON

Ex-Governor Lord Lauds the Institution.

The following is from Ex-Governor Lord's message:

"There are those who think our university should not receive financial support, while there are others who think it is bad policy and worse economy to withhold from it any needed aid. It is no doubt true that taxation is for the general benefit, and that objects of its fostering care should conserve the public good. But the fact that comparatively few can enjoy the university's advantages is not conclusive that its benefits are not for the public welfare. If the university is an essential part of our educational system, is conducive to the progress and development of our state and to the prosperity and intellectual greatness of the people, it is of general benefit and entitled to receive public support. The university aims to furnish such an education as will enable those—always the few—who possess the requisite abilities, to become useful citizens and leaders of thought in the professions, in statesmanship, in the various branches of learning, in philanthropy and works of charity, in promoting industrial projects and conducting commercial enterprises, and in devising methods for the moral and political advancement of the people. Its existence is due to recognition of the fact that the state needs captains in every department of life, affecting human happiness and welfare, and that, as a means to this end, it should provide an institution of learning whose course of study would lay the foundation to supply them; and perhaps, too, some of those benefactors of our race, whose enlightened influences shall hereafter be traced in the improved condition of our species, and in the increased prestige and power of our state. The state cannot afford to wait or depend on local enterprise, or church organizations, to establish and maintain institutions of learning—splendid and worthy as have been their efforts and success—for the accomplishment of these great objects of public concern. The crown of our educational system is the university. We should strive to lift it to a plane where it may compete with similar institutions of other states, and save our children the necessity

MOUNTAINS OF CINNABAR

Controlled by the Black Butte Mining Company Near Cottage Grove.

PUTTING THE PLANT IN SHAPE.

Portland Telegram Jan. 12.

J. Berhman, manager of the Black Butte Quicksilver Mining Company, in Lane county, says the statements to the effect that the mine has shipped \$30,000 worth of quicksilver are misleading. The entire energies of the company have been bent toward getting the mine into shape to ship its product, which is found in great quantities. So far nothing has been shipped, but the mine will soon be in shape to make shipments.

The sum of \$75,000 has been expended on roads, bridges and other improvements. It was found that considerable of the quicksilver escaped through one of the chimneys, and the mine was closed temporarily.

The management does claim that it has one of the finest plants for extracting quicksilver in America. The supply is practically inexhaustible. There are whole mountains of cinnabar, which the company has control of, and next spring the mine will begin shipping in earnest. Knowing that it has a good paying proposition, the management will not begin to ship until everything is in readiness. The thousands of dollars spent on improvements are safe, when there are millions more in the ground when the plant is in shape to turn it into a commercial article.
