THE BRANTON CASE His Efforts to Escape From the Gallows. THE ARGUMENT. SALEM, Feb 21.—In the supreme court, yesterday, the case of the State of Oregon, respondent, vs Claude Branton, appellant, an appeal from the circuit court of Lane county, Hon J W Hamilton, judge, was argued and submitted.

The appellant, Claude Branton, was severely indicted by the grand jury of Lane county, Oregon, on the 20th of October, 1898, charged with the crime of murder in the first degree, by killing John A Linn on the 15th of June, 1898, in Lane county. On the day that the indictment was returned into court the defendant was arraigned, entered a plea of not guilty the following day, and thereafter was duly convicted of murder in the first degree, as charged in the indictment, and was sentenced according to law.

After the trial of the appellant had been set, but before trial had, Courtland Green pleaded guilty to the indictment against him. The counsel for appellant claimed that Green's plea of guilty was an acquittal of Branton and made various moves in the case on that theory, and the ruling of the court thereon is assigned as error.

THE CLOSING HOUR An Element of Pathos; Also of Petty Larceny. Members Loaded With Blunder. Portland Telegram, Feb 20: "There was an element of pathos in the closing scenes of the legislative session in the house. The hour for adjournment fixed by joint resolution had arrived, but the enrollment of the special appropriation bill, the consideration of which by a joint conference committee had prolonged the session one day, had not yet been completed. There was no more business to do other than that of receiving the appropriation bill and the speaker affixing his signature to it.

ALL HELPED THEMSELVES. The disgraced looting of the legislative halls was again in evidence upon the last day of the session. What plunder the members did not want themselves was taken by committee clerks and others, who had no more right to it than the Filipinos. One clerk, who came to Portland on the special train Saturday night, was loaded down with enough waste paper baskets, clips, writing pads and ink wells to make a respectable load for a dray, and yet he struggled under the burden with the consciousness of having done his duty.
