14 Trains Each Day.

This is what it means. On and after March 12th, 1899, the Northern Pacific Railway will start two trains each day, flying westward from its eastern terminals. At the same time—not exactly the same hours—two trains will also leave its western terminals for the east. There will then be, each day, moving over the 2,000 miles of main track between St Paul, Minneapolis and Duluth at the east, and Seattle, Tacoma and Portland on the Pacific coast, fourteen of these trains—in both directions—going at the same time and this in a country where 20 years ago the buffalo were roaming. These trains will be known as No 1 the Paget Limited, No 2 the Twin City Mail, No 4 the Twin City Express, going east, and will contain more than 100 cars of various sorts. Each train will have a mail car, a baggage and express car, first and second class coaches, a free colonists sleeping car, a Pullman tourist sleeping car, a dining car and one or more Pullman first class sleeping cars, so that everybody and everybody's pocketbook can be accommodated. The dining cars are a part of

the solid through trains and need therefore go hungry.

Train No 1 will leave St Paul at 6 a m; train No 3 at 10:35 p m; and trains have arrived from the east in the morning and evening. Train No 2 will leave Portland at 11:00 a m and train No 4 at 11:00 p m, arriving at St Paul 2:30 p m and 7:30 a m, respectively, in time for all departures trains eastward. One train goes to Helena, Montana, and one via Butte in each direction. These trains pass through the most important cities and enormous Schemmately locomotives, making, when necessary, 80 miles an hour.

These diurnal trains will amply accommodate the large immigration of tourist travel that seems probable this year.

During the Yellowstone Park season one train in each direction will carry Pullman first class sleeping cars, especially for park travel.
