PROF MARTIN DEAD

Died of Apoplexy at His Home on the Lakes Near Florence

Prof T M Martin, a pioneer school teacher of Lane county, died at his home on the "Lakes" across from Florence, in Douglas county, Monday morning June 12th from a stroke of apoplexy, aged 64 years, 3 months and 12 days. The fatal blow came some time the night before and he never recovered consciousness.

Prof Martin had an extensive acquaintance throughout Lane county. He came to Eugene in 1865 and commenced his work as pastor of the First Baptist church while still a layman. He was ordained a regular minister of that denomination in Eugene July 11, 1868 and continued in that work for several years. Finally his belief in Christianity experienced a change, and he left the ministry, and engaged in his former occupation as a school teacher. He was principal of the Eugene public schools for several years and afterward taught many terms in other localities throughout the county.

He was first married to Miss Green and to them were born two sons, Will and Carey, both estimable young men. On her death he married a Miss Miner who survives him. The deceased was an old soldier, being a member of the Eugene post, also a Mason in affiliation with the Florence lodge, under whose auspices the burial will take place at Florence Wednesday.

HIS PERSONAL QUALITIES.

Prof Martin had many good qualities that made him friends in every walk of life from the lisping child, whose confidence he obtained at once in the schoolroom, to the mature woman or man who was drawn to him by his sympathetic nature. His general fund of information made him an agreeable companion to men and women of education and intelligence, and that he lived and walked not in a wider sphere could be attributed to but one deficiency in his mental make-up. His was an emotional nature—he lacked balance. And while he worked with vim and vigor at whatever came to his hands, he was apt to tire of his employment.

Writing from a long personal acquaintance with the deceased we can but have words of praise for the nature that was essentially a kindly one; not from education of the brain but because of a truly generous and sympathetic heart. Whatever may have been his shortcomings, they sprang from the excess of emotionalism which was part of his very existence.
