STRUCK GILDED QUARTZ.

Rich Discovery in Bohemian District.

Cottage Grove, Or, July 11.—News was received this evening from Bohemia of another rich strike of free gold in the Music mine. This strike was made in the west end of No 2 level, which has 800 feet of tunnel. The vein is four feet wide and the gold is visible to the eye. This find is richer than the Helena, a gold is heavier and solder than the quartz. This property was recently sold to Montreal and New York parties for \$150,000. I H Bingham, of Spokane, has charge. The property has about 3000 feet of tunnels, and one five and one 10-stamp mill, which are in operation day and night.
