THURSDAY - - - SEPT 21. LEGALIZED ROBBERY.

The Crown cotton mills of Dalton, Georgia, have declared an annual dividend of 93 percent. Last year the dividend was 43 percent. It may be interesting to Oregon people to be informed that President McKinley's tariff gives manufacturers of cotton a minimum tariff protection of 45 percent ad valorem. On some of the schedule the protection reaches 100 percent. Why should our people tax themselves to build up eastern and southern industries and give them enormous profits?

The worst of this outrageous tariff steal is that labor gets no reward. On the other hand it is oppressed and stricken down by the government beneficiaries. These cotton mills, that are making such abnormal profits on investments, employ cheap negro labor, largely, at wages upon which the northern white man cannot possibly exist.

And yet that white man of the North must pay this extraordinary tribute for much of the clothing and household stuffs used by himself and family. A beautiful system, indeed, that allows such plain robbery! No other term fitly characterizes the condition.

THREE FALLEN STARS. The warm weather seems to be particularly disastrous to "divine" healers. In Chicago alone no fewer than three of this small but everlasting class have come to grief since the dog days began, says the Chicago Inter-Ocean.

"The first of the trio was 'Dr' John Alexander Dowie. The coils of the law are gathering about him and his 'Zion.' In his desperation he has appealed to the very courts he erst-while reviled so bitterly to save the property that he has accumulated by the exercise of his 'divine' power. The spectacle of 'Dr' Dowie as a humble and ordinary petitioner before the bench of justice is a refreshing one, and it ought to help restore sight to his blind followers.

"It is now four years since the humdrum life of far-away Albuquerque, N.M., was enlivened by the coming of a stranger who bore a striking physical resemblance to the Christ of art, and who, without

money or price, pretended to do wonders of healing. The whole town was in a fever of excitement. He gave his name as Schlatter, but let it be distinctly understood that he was the promised Messiah come again. His fame extended to both seaboard. All his lofty pretensions to divinity had crumbled away and left him an object of human charity.

"But the strangest part of this tale of humbug and misfortune is the fact that the transient Mrs Schlatter is none other than the once famous Mrs Comer, the Swami Abayamanda of the Adwaita in Chicago. What all this means we do not pretend to know, but in her day this Swami had her following, and a no inconsiderable following, either. Perhaps the faith of this following is still unshaken. Be this as it may, nothing in human affairs is surer than that other stars will arise in the firmament of credulity to take the places of any and all that have fallen to earth. The disappearance of Dowie and Schlatter and Comer will not mean any decline of superstition, and as long as superstition lives there will be plenty of pretenders to respond to its call for marvels and wonders, and latter-day miracles."
