OHIO TALKS.
 "Words Cannot Describe Eugene's Grandeur."
 "CITY OF HOMES."
 The following is taken from the Daily Reflector, of Newark, Ohio, Sept. 12:
 "The night, as usual, was spent in travel, and in the morning we pulled into Eugene, a thriving city of about 5,000. Here we viewed one of the most picturesque landscapes we saw in Oregon. The city is in what seems a vast agricultural plain surrounded and hemmed in by hills and mountains. Words cannot describe its grandeur. It is at the head of the famous Willamette valley. The river is navigable to this point, except at low water stage. Our reception was very cordial and our treatment such that we will carry a long remembrance of this lovely spot. They had been apprised of our coming and laid themselves out to feast us. They did it in high style. They called it a buffet, and it was a "buffet." They did not show us the whole earth, but a good portion of it. But the choice thing they did was to serve a fine breakfast of rainbow trout. Forty men had been following the mountain streams, and their catch was the feature of our breakfast. The meal was like the clam-bake, or barbecue of the South and the corn-roast of the West. The fish were cooked on the spot in large frying pans, and brought in the tables and served smoking hot. Chickens and other meats and fruits in abundance were served also.
 "A few days before we had been surprised with fish. Many of us had been tired of them. Along the trip, at The Dalles, Portland and Astoria, salmon for breakfast, salmon for dinner, salmon for supper—fish, fish, fish. We were sick of them and had said we hoped not to see another fish on the trip. We approached the tables this morning with some reluctance, but a very pleasant surprise awaited us. Mountain trout captivated us, and we ate more fish than we had partaken of at any other place or meal. It was a feast that any gourmand would have relished. The men who were out foraging for trout ran across a bear and killed it. Bruin weighed 400 pounds, and the trophy was displayed as one of the products of the country.
 "The view from the butte resembles very much that from the top of Look-out mountain. You look out into a broad valley and a crooked stream courses below, like that of the Tennessee river. The magnificent forests and mountain ranges that can be seen on every hand are grand and inspiring and make it a very attractive place for either homes or visitors. It has many fine residences and is known as the 'City of Homes.'
 "Eugene is the seat of the State University College. The buildings are of stone and present a very imposing appearance from the eminence where we feasted. One of them, Villard Hall, was named in commemoration of Henry Villard, of Northern Pacific fame, who gave \$50,000, a great financial aid to the college. It is a leading institution of the West. A divinity school is located here also. The length of our stay here did not permit us to see much of them, or of the town. At this place we met Mr. Frank I. Gibbs, cousin of James G. Gibbs, who, with his wife, was expectant upon meeting their relative. We explained his absence the best we could. He (Mr. Frank Gibbs) is one of the county officials and is thoroughly in love with Oregon life."

TO BUY BIG RANCHES.
 Swift Interests Said to Have in Contemplation Big Purchases—In Conference at Chicago.
 Chicago, Sept. 19.—A special to the Tribune from Kansas City says: G. B. Swift, the Chicago banker; Charles Coffman and C. T. Hall, of this city; W. Jennings and C. C. Camp, of San Antonio, Tex., and C. T. Jennings and F. E. Ellison, of Fort Worth, were in conference here today examining titles to a number of ranches which it is said the Swift interests contemplate purchasing. Among them is the Chalfress ranch, in the pan-handle of Texas containing in the neighborhood of 200,000 acres, and upon which 10,000 head of cattle are now grazing. It is only a few days ago that the Swifts purchased the O'Keefe ranch in Galves county, Tex., containing 180,000 acres and it is stated that Swift & Co. and Nelson Morris, who has also recently interested heavily in ranches, will raise cattle on a large scale.
