SANTA FE IS PROGRESSIVE,

Its Latest Deal Makes It a Competitor Against S. P. for South American Business.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 20.—The Examiner says that the Santa Fe people have a traffic arrangement with the Komo Steamship Company, a German organization, with San Diego as the point of transfer between car and ship. The steamship company is to deliver to the Santa Fe and Sandiego products of Mexico, Central America and South America, destined to places in this country, especially to points west of Chicago and St. Louis.

In turn the Santa Fe will deliver to it under an agreed true rate, American products destined to the Pacific ports of the various countries mentioned. This arrangement strengthens the Komo company as a competitor of the Pacific Mail. It also means the entrance of the Santa Fe into Mexico, Central America and South American fields of trade as a competitor of the Southern Pacific and Pacific Mail Companies.

AT BLUE RIVER

A Small Cave-in at the Lucky Boy Mill.

An accident of slight proportions occurred at the Lucky Boy mill, Blue River, last Saturday incident to the starting of the mill.

During the day the engine was started and the crusher operated for a few hours. That night a small cave-in occurred from the upper end of the cut on which the mill stands, striking the engine room and buried a wheel and some water pipes, which it damaged slightly.

Felix Sparks who came down from Blue River last night states the damage was considered trifling, and from other sources it is learned that it was expected the falling dirt would be cleared away in one day. The slide was probably caused by the vibration of the engine as the cut was not timbered. The mill has already started up again.

Obituary.

H. C. Huston was born in Washington county, Indiana, May 10, 1825. Moved to Iowa in 1850, and the same year went to Missouri. He crossed the plains to Oregon with the emigration of 1852 and permanently settled in Lane county in 1853 on the place where he died, twelve miles west of Eugene on the "American" bottom.

Mr Huston served in the volunteer army that was organized to quell the Indian outbreaks in Southern Oregon in 1855-6. He enlisted in company C, Second recruiting battalion, and was mustered in at Eugene City, March 29, 1856. With his company, after having seen service in the Umpqua and Rogue River valleys, and the Indians having been whipped into submission, he was mustered out July 3, 1856. He leaves few of the comrades who marched with him to protect the settlers.

At the general election of 1896 Mr. Huston was elected a state senator from Lane county as a democrat, the party with which his affiliations were life long. More than thirty years later in 1898, he was again a candidate for the same office, this time on the Union ticket, but was defeated.

Mr. Huston was married in 1866 to Miss Lydia Zumwalt, daughter of Isaac Zumwalt of Irving precinct. Twelve children were born to the union, ten of whom survive. He was 71 years, 7 months and 8 days of age. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. J. C. Richardson. The minister who thus paid the last sad tribute to his friend had first met him nearly half a century ago. The one in his teens, the deceased in the first flush of manhood. The text was the 5th verse of the 90th psalm. A large concourse of friends paid their last respects to the pioneer.

H. C. Huston had some of the qualities of genius, and had fortune placed the current of his life in a different channel his name would not have been confined to a neighborhood. As it was he lived a good citizen, a faithful husband and a kind father.

Letter From San Juan Puerto Rico.

S. Handaker is in receipt of a letter from I. J. Hughes, a former comrade and member of Company B, which was enlisted in Eugene in 1855, to fight the Indians in Southern Oregon. A few extracts follow:

"I was well acquainted in Eugene," says Mr. Hughes, "when there were no houses to hide the town, only Eugene Skinner's home on the south side of the Butte, and Jim Huddleston's, between the butte and the river on the north side.

"I think the writer of the clipping you sent, telling about the times we had in the campaign of '55-'56, was our old comrade, H. C. Huston. "Puerto Rico is 700 miles due east of Jamaica, the island of St. Domingo lying directly between them, while the east end of Cuba is 100 miles north of Jamaica and 700 miles west of this island.

"I had been living awhile in Jamaica where 19 out of 20 are black, and was surprised to see so many white people here, about half of the population.

"The island has not been so productive of late, because Spain levied such a heavy export tax that it did not pay to produce sugar and coffee, the principal products. There has never been but a small part of the island cultivated.

"This island is considered healthy and yellow fever is not common on the land, but is sometimes on the ships. Times are hard and money is scarce.

There has been but little change here. In place of Spain collecting the custom duty, "Uncle Sam" collects it off of himself and other nations. And we have our own soldiers in place of Spaniards, which is much more agreeable. The United States is running on the Spanish import duty, which in some instances is quite prohibitory.

"I have done fairly well, but have been seriously afflicted. In July I was stricken with paralysis from the waist down. I am improving, but will perhaps never be entirely well.

"On the 12th of last August we had a storm that destroyed nearly all our fruit and damaged the crops greatly, killing 2000 persons on this island.

"Beggars are very numerous here, for begging is a trade." Great Salt Lake Disappearing.
