PRESIDENT STRONG AT SALEM.

Highly Complimented for His Lecture Before the Teachers.

Extracts from Salem Journal:

President Frank Strong, of the State University at Eugene, was now introduced, and gave an address on "What Should the High School Course of Study Include?"

President Strong has a voice and enunciation which made every word understood without effort throughout the hall, and it hardly seemed possible that he was speaking in the cavern of indistinct and unearthly noises which the hall of representatives usually resembles.

President Strong talks sense; and he puts it in good strong simple English, with meaning in it and thought behind it. Without any attempt to borrow the flowers of language he drives through his subjects, making his points with a clearness and precision which leaves no doubt as to his meaning.

He calls a spade a spade and seems to have the courage to state things as he sees them.

He strongly advocated the improvement in our educational facilities and especially secondary schools, or high schools. The high school is the people's college. Free public schools lead to free high schools; free high schools lead to free universities.

It was absolutely essential that the standard of our schools be raised, and some figures were produced to show how far behind Oregon is in this regard.

He deprecated the excessively high regard in which arithmetic is commonly held, and advocated a more general use of latin as a disciplinary study. We must elevate our standard of education or Oregon would be a hewer of wood and a drawer of water for other communities.

President Strong's address was very much in the nature of the dash of cold water with which wise parents sometimes bring their overloving children out of bed in the morning. It was a strong, courageous, uncompromising statement of the situation in Oregon, and the necessity for action of the right kind.

The statement that is the matter of high schools, Oregon is so far behind some of the states which we are in the habit of considering illiterate is a wholesome stimulant. Thirteen in Oregon to over 100 in Georgia is a fact. President Strong's address ought to be a read before every voter in Oregon.
