Scotland seems a strange place to find a statue of Abraham Lincoln, and yet there is one there. It adorns a monument erected in old Calton burying ground, Edinburgh to the memory of the Scottish Americans who fought in the Civil War.

Men exposed to the rigors of the Alaskan winters never wear mustaches. They wear full beards to protect the throat and face, but keep the upper lip clean shaven. The moisture from the throat congeals so quickly that a mustache becomes imbedded in a solid cake of ice, and the face is frozen in a short time.

Evidently the British war office has decided on a radical change of commanders in South Africa. Simultaneously reports emanate that Generals Methuen, Buller, Yule and Gatacre are in very bad health. They have not been successful in hunting the wily and courageous Boer. That explains the anticipated change of commanders.

American enterprise occasionally gets our citizens into trouble. Seattle is excited over the report that a former well known business man of that city is under arrest in Austria for buying girls for export to the United States. If Austrian laws are what they should be it will be a long time before our thrifty countryman gets sight of this land of liberty.

Another proof of prosperity: John Jacob Astor who has large holdings of New York property has served notices on tenants whose leases expire May 1, that ground rents will be raised from \$350 to \$750 a year. Many tenants who leased the ground and built on part credit will lose their investments by reason of the heavy increase of rentals. A millionaire squeeze.

Land grabbing over in Asia comes high. Congress has been asked to make good a debt of \$50,000,000 that President McKinley has incurred in the prosecution of the war in the Philippines. The president has spent an additional \$300,000,000, not a cent of which was granted, for the purpose of plunging the country into a career of imperialism and land grabbing. And he has run the government \$50,000,000 into debt.

Our neighbors across the boundary line will try to discipline a man who tramped on the British flag and the queen's portrait in a saloon. Probably he had interviewed too much of the fine cordials for which Victoria is famous. The enormity of the offense, as viewed by the Boer hunting Britons, is shown by the fact that the attorney general called the attention of the legislature to the fact, and promised to prosecute the offender as far as British Columbia laws would warrant.

A postal officer at Davenport who has charge of a free delivery route in Iowa declares that the chief beneficiaries of the innovation are women. The bulk of the rural mail handled is to and from the farmers' wives and daughters. This is not surprising, nor is it any reason why the system should not be generally encouraged. Aside from business letters, a man writes seldom, unless it is to his wife when away on a journey. He seldom writes to his masculine friends, while women carry on correspondence with other women whom they have not seen for years.

Orchardists will have to trim up their orchards and spray the trees. The state board of horticulture, at its quarterly meeting held in Portland January 10, decided to prosecute all orchardists who refuse to comply with the law in that respect. The law is a good one, but the board has a big job before it. Still if due notice fails to produce the desired effect a few prosecutions in different sections of the state will awaken owners of neglected orchards to the realization that they will not be allowed to maintain breeding places for pests that will find their way to healthy orchards.

HIS CHANCES SLIM.
Little Prospect of Hale getting the Alaska Judgeship.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10. - In face of the opposition it is very doubtful if Judge Hale, endorsed by the Oregon delegation for district judge of Alaska, will secure the appointment. The delegations of Washington, Idaho, Wyoming, Montana and Indiana, all have candidates for the office, and it is said that Senator Carter already has the promise of the appointment. Senator Fairbanks is pushing a prominent judge of his state for the place and is backed by a number of the Indiana representatives. In view of these facts it is hardly possible for Oregon to name the successor to Judge Johnson, but if, as contemplated, other districts are created, Judge Hale will have an excellent chance for success. Senators McBride and Simon formally presented his name to the president as Oregon's choice for the place.
