THE BURDEN ON THE BACK OF TOLL.

Out of the tremendous effort to overthrow Napoleon and his ambition to rule the world was developed a system of bonded indebtedness so huge that all hope of ever paying it has vanished from human thought. Then cunning suggested the making of bankruptcy a system of finance, and calling the bonds of the debts for wars and ruins and all the debris of Time's devouring tooth capital, whence to draw interest off labor. In all times before such debts of nations were wiped out like those of bankrupt individuals, and the nations started anew with clean slates.

But now the future is bound under hopeless and increasing debt to the past. There is not the least hope of ultimate payment of the vast sums with which the monarchies of the old world are burdened. But the interest must be paid, and the scanty wages of poverty and toil contribute what it can ill afford, and which is the greater part of the revenue that sustains the systems that grind the common people to the earth. We give a few of the more striking examples:

France \$6,200,000,000; a per capita indebtedness of \$175.
Austria-Hungary and Hungary \$3,225,000,000; per capita \$75.
Great Britain \$3,200,000,000; per capita \$87.
Russia \$3,400,000,000; per capita \$30.
Prussia \$1,700,000,000; per capita \$45.
Spain \$1,500,000,000; per capita \$80.

When it is considered that in most of those countries the average annual wages of working men are little if any more than the per capita indebtedness, the hopelessness of ultimate payment may be realized. The debts are not expected to be paid. But ever absorbing interest saps national vitality.
