STILL FIGHTING

Heavy Battle at Ladysmith Still In Progress

BRITISH MAKE SLIGHT ADVANCES

LONDON, Jan. 22.—Heavy fighting has occurred before Ladysmith Sunday and today, with nothing decisive so far reported. It is known that the British are making a slight advance against a very hot fire. Sunday the Boers receded to a second semi-circle recalling the ruse with which the British had previously been enticed into a fatal trap.

But," added the senator, with a glitter of the eye, "if anybody catches up with me there will be trouble."—Indianapolis Press.

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STABILIUM AFFRAY.

Alce Lewis, Worst in An Affliction With M. J. Arnel.

A report was brought down from Mohawk today, that Marcellus Arnel had stabbed Alce Lewis quite severely, inflicting three wounds, none of which are necessarily fatal. Upon complaint being made a warrant was sworn out in Justice Wintermeier's court for the arrest of Mr. Arnel, and Sheriff Withers went up to bring Arnel down for examination. Particulars regarding the trouble which led to the stabbing could not be obtained from the officers as little is known here about the affair except the mere fact of its occurrence. Dr. Cheshire was called to attend Mr. Lewis and left this morning. He has not yet returned.

A Raid Upon Cottage Grove.

J. W. Geary Post, No. 7, and Rich Mountain Circle, No. 4, L. of G. A. R., made a raid upon Ord Post, No. 13, G. A. R., Friday evening, January 19. They got a dispatch that we were coming, and took the proper steps to receive us. We were met at the depot by the city marshal, accompanied by comrades and ladies, and escorted to the post room direct, where an address of welcome was delivered by the commander of Ord Post, No. 13, responded to by Comrades Burlingame, Chapman and others. Then a council of war was held, and picket guards sent out to protect chickens, pigs, etc. Early next morning an alarm was sounded in the direction of the Griffin Hardware Store. Colonel Chapman and Captain Beadle hurried to the scene and were astonished to see Comrade Rowland leaving the store with a big steel range upon his back (weight 450 pounds), to be used in camp for cooking pigs, chickens and ham, and was promptly arrested by the above officers just in time to save \$50 to the post. Finally the pickets were called in and the comrades were directed to the L. O. O. F. hall, where they found the ladies of the G. A. R. in waiting for the purpose of organizing a new circle of the L. of G. A. R.

The officers of the new Circle, No. 11, were duly elected and installed by Post Department Commander Frank Reiser, assisted by the president and officers of Rich Mountain Circle, No. 4, L. of G. A. R. The new circle will have about 25 names on its charter. We understand there are about sixty thousand Circle members in the United States, and the good work will be pushed with vigor until all the mothers, wives, daughters and granddaughters of old soldiers are safe within the Circle of the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic.

A good time was had, and all were well pleased with the result of our raid on Cottage Grove. When all was over we were escorted to the depot by the newly organized circle and comrades of Ord Post, bearing Old Glory at the head of the column. There were twenty-one comrades, their wives and daughters, who took part in the grand raid. All voted it a success.
