TRANSVAAL WAR MAY BRING FINANCIAL DISASTER.

The Paris Le Natin fears a financial crisis as the result of the war between the Boers and Great Britain. Here is the reasoning of the French journal:

During the period of the continuance of the war the English money market will be deprived of the 80,000,000 or 85,000,000 francs of gold which the Transvaal mines were furnishing it monthly; it will be called upon to meet all the engagements contracted in England for the account of the different countries of South America and the Far East, as well as all the other foreign demands that will inevitably be engendered by the crisis; and lastly, it will be bound to supply the British government with the five or six hundred million francs representing the cost of the war during the next three months. Thus it is probable that gold will continue to appreciate and become scarcer in Europe. We anticipate that the most acute period of the English monetary crisis will be towards the end of February, 1900 - unless, indeed, there be intervention for the restoration of peace in the meantime.

When it is finished the official history of the War of the Rebellion will be the costliest book in the world. It is being issued by the Government of the United States, and at a cost up to date of about \$2,000,000. It will consist of 112 volumes, including an index and an atlas, which contains 178 plates and maps illustrating the important battles of the war, campaigns, routes of march, plans of forts and photographs of interesting scenes, places and persons.

San Francisco is having another high-binder war, the worst in years. The mysterious Chinese societies recognize no civilized law, and when a real or supposed injury is inflicted by one "tong" toward another, an era of murder and crime begins which often lasts for a long period of time. The cunning of the highbinders is usually more than a match for the vigilance of the police and few of the offenders are ever brought to justice.

A party of gentlemen, among whom was Walt Whitman, the poet, once visited an institution

somewhere east where a number of Indians were kept in captivity. With the exception of Whitman, to whom the Indians were very friendly, the party was sullenly and morosely received. Whitman explained the exception in his favor by saying: "They recognized the savage in me."

The difference which thirty years sometimes makes has been very concisely put by a biographer writing the character of a certain king "At eighteen, he was a gay and handsome prince, skilled in music and ready with his pen. At forty-eight, he was an unwieldy mass of corrupted flesh and evil passions."

The hurricane that wrought such destruction in the West Indies in August proves to be the longest on record. It can be traced over the North Atlantic for 36 days, and seems finally to have disappeared off the coast of Provence, where it caused a rough sea and northwest gales on September 9 to 11.

There are certain lucky creatures which never feel the pangs of thirst, for they are so constituted that drink is unnecessary to them, and they never swallow a drop of water in their lives. Among these animals are certain gazelles of the far East and the llamas of Patagonia.

The Boers are farmers, but they do not go to war with plowshares and pruning hooks. They have a great many long-range guns and other instruments of war which cannot be obtained at an agricultural implement store.
