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ASSASSINATION

William Goebel, of Kentucky,
Killed Today.

COLUMBINATION OF POLITICAL NOTIONNESS.

Special to the GUARD.

FRANKFORT, Ky., Jan. 30.—Hon. Wm. Goebel, contestant with Hon. W. S. Taylor, for the seat of governor of Kentucky, was assassinated today.

The murder is the outcome of one of the most bitter political fights which has ever occurred in this state. The crowds in the streets are enormous, and people frantic. It is impossible to secure intelligent information regarding the crime.

One thousand of Taylor's friends armed with Winchesters have been here for several days, and the Goebel men are now massing rapidly. The outlook is ominous, and vigorous steps must be at once taken to restore order, and prevent more crime.

(William Goebel came forward this year as a comparatively new figure in Kentucky politics, but displayed a great talent for organization. The democratic convention met in June last, and after sessions protracted for about a week State Senator William Goebel was nominated for governor.

The platform endorsed Mr. Bryan; declared for the 16-to-1 ratio; denounced trusts as the fruit of republican monopoly and tariff laws; and condemned the administration's Philippine policy. Goebel's methods were bitterly denounced by influential elements of the party, which came together later at Lexington on August 18, and nominated an independent democratic democratic ticket headed by ex-Governor John Young Brown. This convention also endorsed Mr. Bryan, but it devoted most of its platform to a detailed denunciation of Goebel, his election law and his political methods. It was this means that W. S. Taylor, who was attorney-general, and who received the nomination for governor, succeeded in the election, not however until Goebel had carried the matter to the supreme court. Mr. Bryan made speeches in Kentucky during the first week of October for the Goebel ticket as representing the regular party organization, with special reference to the fact that the success of that ticket meant the return of Mr. Bryan's friend, Hon. J. C. S. Blackburn, to the U. S. senate. Practically nothing is obtainable at this time regarding the private life of Mr. Goebel. Suffice it is to say that this assassination is likely to cause much trouble. The crime is the pinnacle of disgrace brought about by the rottenness of political methods.)

ARRESTED.—Alex. Eaton, the well-known pioneer of Creswell, was arrested yesterday on the charge of carrying a concealed weapon, consisting of a small dirk used by him as a penknife, on complaint of a young man. He was tried this afternoon before Justice Miller at Creswell. L. T. Harris appeared for the state and G. W. Kinsey for the plaintiff.

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EXCELSIOR MILL.

Machinery Being Set Up—Will Soon Be in Operation.

Workmen are busy putting in the machinery of the excelsior plant, a car load of which arrived from Lebanon Saturday. In the list of machinery are two balers, one weighing 7000 pounds and the other 6700 pounds. A battery of eight knives will be started at first, although the proprietors expect to increase this capacity, and have built to provide for a larger output. Mr. Peterson informed a GUARD reporter that some excelsior will probably be made within a week, but much work will yet be necessary before the plant is working smoothly. The plant will start up with a capacity of about 8000 pounds in 8 hours.

A large force of men is now employed in setting up the machinery and finishing the building, together with the adjusting of pulleys, belts, drying wood for the plant, and the many other things needed to be done.

This is the most important industry to come to Eugene during the past year, and there is room for more.
