AN EXPLANATION REQUIRED.

The charge made by Maorum, late United States consul at Pretoria, that his official mail had been tampered with by the British, deserves thorough investigation and, if found true, suitable reparation should be demanded.

There is one phase of the matter, however, that requires explanation. Consul Maorum deserted his post to come home to make this ugly charge against a friendly nation. He says that was his "one object in returning," and that "if the department thought the facts were of value sufficient to warrant the expense of the trip," he "expected to be remunerated, and returned to Pretoria."

When one considers that the ex-consul would have found little trouble in sending any official communication to his chief at Washington through the regular mail service and by messenger, this trip of thirteen thousand miles, with the expectation of being returned to the Boer cause, in any event to disrupt the friendly relations between this country and great Britain. The incident certainly has the appearance of being concocted to win sympathy for the Boers. It is hardly probable that the man who deserted his post will be again placed in the responsible position.

The Oregonian's Washington, D. C., correspondent telegraphs: "The list of men who attended the Annapolis convention and nominated Palmer and Buckner, contained a large number of eminent democrats. Some of these who supported Palmer and Buckner for McKinley in the campaign four years ago, are now with the Bryan democracy. The list is not very long, nor are the names very prominent in party councils. Some of the most important men of this class are Governor Smith of Maryland, Mayor Hayes of Baltimore, Bourke Cochran of New York, Ben Cable of Illinois, Michael Doran of Minnesota, D. H. Chamberlain, ex-governor of South Carolina, Gamaliel Bradford, Thomas W. Higginson and ex-Representative John Crosby of Massachusetts, Oliver Belmont and Edward M. Shepard of New York. This about completes the list of

men who refused to support Bryan in 1896, but who now accept Bryanism."
