LANE'S TIMBER.

She Leads All Counties in This Valuable Product.

28,800,000,000 FEET.

A special report of the geological survey, prepared by Henry Gannett, just issued, on the forests of the Western states, and particularly of the Pacific coast. This report shows that the timber in the state of Oregon reaches the enormous total of 234,553,000,000 feet, board measure. This timber is found mainly in the Coast range, and on the west slope of the Cascade range. Lane county has more than any other county in the state, with a total of 28,800,000,000 board feet, while Douglas county comes in a close second, with 23,854,000,000 feet; Clatsop, with 16,476,000,000 feet, follows, and from that it runs down to but 470,000,000 feet in Morrow county, and none in Sherman.

City of Eugene in Trouble.

The Oregonian of today comments thusly:

"The freak steamer City of Eugene, was tied up by the United States marshal yesterday, to satisfy a claim held by Purser Gray. The career of this steamer has been a continued hard-luck story from the time she was launched. She was neither beautiful, economical or fast, and accordingly, was handicapped in the race for business on the river. She was modeled after the style of boats in service on the Mississippi 'before the war,' and it was somewhat of a surprise to the experienced steamboatman that she kept moving as long as she has."

Engineer Isaac Gray, informs us that the crew libeled the boat for \$1879.74 wages due, yesterday morning, Thomas & Chamberlain being their attorneys. He says she does not owe over \$100 in bills in Portland. She now lies at the city levy, being under the supervision of the U. S. marshal, with Lon Moore as watchman. Mr. Gray says that the crew must be paid from the first sale's money, claims next, mortgages, and stockholders coming on farther down the line. Of course stock holders get nothing; they never do. It is likely she will be sold in about 30 days. A small bill for \$35 was the immediate cause of the trouble, the amount being owed to the Portland Awning Co."

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VACCINATION

Public School Children to Be Protected.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The board of directors of school district No. 4, after a consultation with the city board of health, has decided that a wise course to be pursued is to secure the vaccination of all public school pupils so far as practicable, and present the following report:

The Board of Directors of school district No. 4, consider it their duty to earnestly recommend vaccination of all the children attending school, as far as not done. While there is no cause for immediate alarm, this modern precaution against a disease, which might turn epidemic and malignant, appears to be imperative. Our health authorities insist upon the fact, that smallpox in a discreet form has been existing in this county. There are no cases in Eugene.

Changing climatic influence might affect the nature of the disease; thus one serious case would spread great excitement in our community.

Vaccination with pure bovine lymph, especially prepared, is absolutely harmless.

All that is necessary, is a careful, cleanly application.

A number of our physicians expressed their readiness to vaccinate school children at a nominal fee, covering the cost of the bovine lymph. Other physicians who could not be consulted as yet, no doubt will join in the movement.

All school children will be provided with a certificate from their teacher. This will entitle them to a vaccination at the low price of 25 cents each.

Special warning is given against vaccination from human virus.
