REAL FIGHTING TO COME.

England has 200,000 soldiers in South Africa, and the Boers claim they have 120,000 fighters in the field. The forces on both sides are charged with splendid courage and determination. The real fighting of this war is yet to come. Before the struggle is ended, decisive battles must be fought, battles with terrific losses on one or both sides and which will leave one of the engaging armies crushed and exhausted.

At Gettysburg, July 1-3, 1863, 83,000 Union soldiers under Meade lost 23,000 men, or nearly 27 per cent of the army. In the same battle the Confederates under Lee lost 10,448 of their 69,000 soldiers. Compared with these losses, the South African engagements on the Modder river and the Tugela have been little more than skirmishes in force. They have decided nothing. Indeed, they have only strengthened the determination of the opposing armies. We have heard sweeping in English homes. We shall hear, ere the cruel war be ended, a deeper burst of lamentation.
