A COMPARISON.

Linn county, with more population, more voters, and some more taxable property, runs the county on less than \$35,000, and only has a tax levy of 14 mills, and does not have an outstanding warrant, although she remodeled her courthouse at considerable expense last year.

Lane county spent the following amounts for county purposes in 1898 \$89,075.48. In 1899 \$88,520.06.

Lane county has outstanding unpaid warrants and interest amounting to \$115,000.00.

Lane county has a Tax Levy of 23 1-2 Mills.

Lane county erected a courthouse two years ago at an estimated cost of \$74,000.

Voters and taxpayers should compare the above figures. They are official.

It is refreshing to find one article that has advanced in price from some other reason than trust manipulation. Carboic acid is another article that makes the druggist tired, also the person that buys it in any quantity. The price has advanced from thirty cents a pound to ninety cents.

This is the week of Rev. Sheldon's Kansas paper. This reverend gentleman is engaged in the implausible attempt to run a paper "as Jesus would run it." Yet he charges twenty-five cents for the week's issue of the paper, which is double and treble the usual price of daily papers. It is claimed that the proceeds, above cost of issuing the publication, will be donated to the poor of Kansas. It is not unlikely that the "poor" of that state will be found camping very closely about that newspaper office.

Mr. Norman E. Mack, the Buffalo Democratic editor, is credited with knowing New York politics thoroughly. He says that with the exception of a few incorporation and trust lawyers, the party in that state is in line with Col. Bryan, and expresses the belief that the recent financial transactions of the treasury department have materially aided the Democratic cause and that the state will elect a Democratic governor and presidential electors next November.

The Standard Oil Company has made its members so wealthy that they cannot find use for their surplus money in that corporation, even with its world-wide business. It is in combination with the Rothschilds to control the copper output of the world and last year received profits therefrom to the estimated extent of twenty-five million dollars.
