THE RICHMOND CASE. It is Being Tried in the City of Portland.

Today's Oregonian. F. L. Richmond, who has sued the Southern Pacific Company for \$10,000 damages, told his story of the accident, and pictured his suffering as the result of injuries sustained, before a jury in Judge Frazer's court yesterday. The trial will be resumed today.

On March 27, 1899, Richmond, who is a commercial traveler, boarded a local freight train at Oakland, Or., to go to Eugene. He testified that the train was making slow time, so he determined to get off at Cottage Grove, and he arose from his seat and asked the conductor for part of his mileage back. The train at this movement gave a sudden jolt, and Richmond was thrown down, he says, very violently, and sustained a concussion of the spine, and injuries to his arm, back, leg and hip.

He was confined to his bed, he asserted, for six weeks, and has not yet recovered. Dr. W. Kuykendall is one of the witnesses.
