Water already exists along the shore of the river at places between Dawson and White Horse, and at Caribou Crossing ice has completely disappeared from shore to shore. On parts of Lake Bennett water is a foot deep. The Canadian Development Company is preparing to use wagons on the Dominion cut-off.

Very few of those now on the way in with supplies will reach Dawson. The Dominion cut-off is particularly bad, and many will probably be blockaded at Five Fingers.

Robert Johnson, manager of the big 155-acre prune orchard north of Corvallis, believes peaches to be considerably damaged, but declares that in his company's orchard Italians are practically uninjured, and that the crop prospect is altogether favorable.

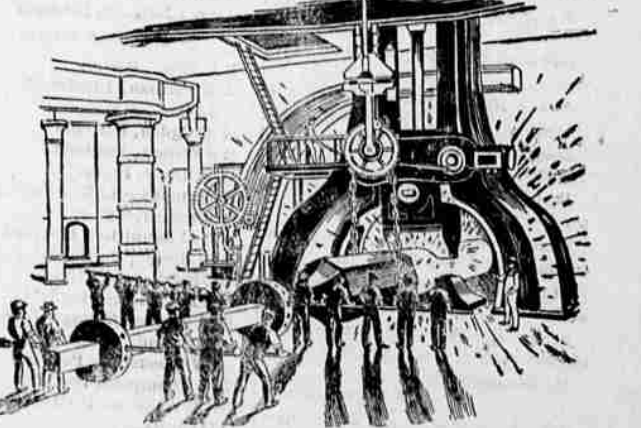
