A correspondent asks the GUARD to give the tax levies and financial condition of our neighbor counties. We have no information except as to the tax levies:

On February 20, 1900 Lane county had a warrant interest bearing debt of \$110,947.80.

Is there a taxpayer in Lane county that does not believe that this large indebtedness and attendant high rate of taxation are sufficient reasons for the careful selection of the men who will administer the county affairs for the next four years? The Register, the accredited newspaper of the Republican party in Lane county, says this high tax rate and indebtedness are alright. Are they

samples of the economy that the Republican county platform pledges its nominees to enforce?

It is a condition of affairs that calls for sound financial judgment, and a careful choice of candidates who may be depended upon to fulfill the pledges that have been made by both political parties. H. R. Kincaid, for county judge, and J. R. Hill, for county commissioner, are both careful, conservative men who have made a success of their own affairs, and are large taxpayers. We believe that they are the proper men to conduct the business of the county for the next four years.

J. L. Taylor, Republican nominee for county commissioner, pays 36 cents tax. (A special tax of 1 cent a head on 36 sheep.) J. R. Hill, Citizens' candidate, pays \$1.13 tax.
