A TAX RHAPSODY.

The Register of this morning devotes its column of editorial space to an attempt to convince its readers that there is glory in high taxation, presumably to quiet the nerves of the people who are compelled to contribute 23.50 mills on the dollar to the taxgatherer. Of course the Register does not call especial, or any attention, in fact, to the Lane county levy, neither does it advert to the county interest bearing indebtedness of \$110,997.80, (February 20, 1900). It would have people believe that those who advocate the election of a county court pledged to strict economy in county affairs are moonshiners, and opposed to public improvements. If it were not for that twenty-three and a half mill levy, and that hundred thousand dollar indebtedness the Register editorial would be very

impressive. We give the closing paragraph:
"Taxes? The Indian doesn't pay any taxes, neither does he have any roads to speak of, no court-houses, nor is there an extensive immigration of capital into his domain."
And this from the main organ of the party that has nominated a candidate for county commissioner to help disburse the \$250,000 county expenditures for the next four years who pays but 36 cents "taxes!" However that candidate is 36 cents more profitable to the county than the Indian who "doesn't pay any taxes"—that is if you keep him out of the county court.

A JOURNALISTIC DEMAGOGUE.

The Oregonian is the only paper published in the state of Oregon that has a general circulation throughout the length and breadth thereof. With such a field in which to do business, read as it is and must be by men of all shades of political opinion, it is passing strange that it will play the demagogue and even descend below the level of the pot-house politician. Witness this from the Sunday issue:
"Every man that votes the Fusion ticket June 4 votes to tie a millstone about the neck of Oregon industry, to throttle trans-Pacific trade, to continue the subversion of this coast to the influence that have hitherto held back its progress. Every man that votes the Fusion ticket June 4 votes to kill business in every Pacific Coast city and saddle hardship on the children he will leave behind."

Just think of the absurdity of the Oregonian's creed! One half the citizens of the state, 49.04 per cent, voted for Bryan; to restore one-third of our money, now in circulation, or held in vaults at full face value, to the position it held in the financial affairs of the government for almost a century until struck down by a band of conspirators who sought the enhancement of gold security values. They voted against the Republican system of political economy that has bred trusts on every hand like mosquitoes are multiplied in stagnant summer waters. They voted against that system of finance that has appreciated the value of gold, while the value of products of labor and the soil have been correspondingly decreased.

And yet the Oregonian has the effrontery to tell the people that a vote for the Union ticket, that is pledged to better county and state government, is a vote to "kill business" and "saddle hardship on the children he (the voter) will leave behind him." This from the representative paper whose home city is mortgaged high upon business and financial death under these gold standard times is truly refreshing.
