COUNTY TREASURER'S OFFICE.

Persons who are familiar with the manner in which the office of the Lane county treasurer has been conducted for years uniformly give Treasurer Patterson praise for strict attention to business.

Under former treasurers the office in the courthouse was closed a no inconsiderable portion of the time, and persons having warrants to cash were compelled to visit the banks or, during tax collection times in other days, when the county had no one hundred and ten thousand dollar debt, pass them into the sheriff's office. For many years ex-County Clerk Ware cashed no inconsiderable proportion of county and school warrants, the treasurer leaving money with him for that purpose. And the doors of the treasurer's office were looked for days at a time.

It is different now. Go to the courthouse at any hour of the business day and you will find "Abe" Patterson in his office ready to transact any business that pertains to his official duties. It is a pleasant departure from the old established regime.

DAIRY AND FOOD COMMISSIONER.

Wm. Schulmerich, the Democratic-people's nominee for dairy and food commissioner, is a resident of Washington county, where he has been engaged in the dairy business for a number of years, conducting one of the largest and most successful dairies in that section of the state.

He was born in Eldorado county, Cal., and is a German. With his parents he came to Oregon in 1875, when he was 14 years of age. Notwithstanding he was borne of this

country, he speaks the German language, and is the only nominee on the state tickets who is a German.

Mr. Schulmerich has made a financial success of the dairy business when others have failed. He has done this because he has made a thorough study of the business. He has done much to advance the interests of the State Dairy Association in a practical way, and has been very active in bringing to public notice all efforts of adulteration in the dairy line.

He is at present the vice-president of the state association, and has a large acquaintance with state dairymen, all of whom recognize his fitness and capability to properly administer the duties of the office to which he aspires.

A CHANCE TO EXPLAIN.

Register, May 10: J. L. Taylor, who will be county commissioner after the June election, is in Eugene from Hermann.

While Mr. Taylor is in town he should have the Register make some explanation of his 36 cents tax he pays on 36 head of sheep as a special tax of one cent a head. If Mr. Taylor has any anxiety to help disburse the \$250,000 that will pass through the hands of the county court for county purposes during the next four years he should explain how it is that he does not pay one cent of the amount that the taxpayers are paying into the county treasury this year on that 23.50 mills levy.

Personally we have no objection to Mr. Taylor, but ordinary business prudence and foresight demand the selection of a man for commissioner who has substantial interests in the county otherwise than a mere place of residence.

Mr. Taylor does not fulfill the conditions that should be required of a county commissioner, and should not be elected. This is not a matter of sentiment and politics. It is a plain business proposition that affects the welfare of every taxpayer in the county.

DERELICT VOTERS.

The Lane county registration books make it evident that not a few voters failed to vote at previous elections, probably not less than ten to twenty per cent. There will be some who will not register, but this class will probably be small on account of the extended period of time allowed for registration, also the fact that the presidential election in November spurs some people who would not register under ordinary circumstances. We give some figures:

1896—Voters for state senator and county clerk: 4,414.

1898—For senator: 3,885; for clerk: 3,913.

Registration as near as may be estimated to date 4,700, with but five days in which to complete registration.
