OUR ORIENTAL TRADE.

The Oregonian prints this in bold, black letter:

"If a man wants to discredit the gold standard and shut American trade out of the Orient, the best way he can do it is to scratch the Republican ticket June 4."

The Portland paper does not inform its readers as to the extent of "American trade" in the Orient, but from the prominence given the above announcement evidently would have them believe it something wonderful. Figures give a quietus to the Oregonian scare. The World Almanac of 1900 gives the latest figures obtainable at date of publication in regard to our exports for the year 1898:

China.....\$14,437,422.
Japan.....17,158,970.

There is the trade, principally breadstuffs, that you can promote and encourage by voting the "Republican ticket June 4." It is a mere bagatelle of our world com-

merce, hardly worth a mention when compared with our European trade. Great Britain alone in 1898 having taken American exports, principally agricultural products, to the value of \$505,668,925.

The Oregonian insults the intelligence of its readers by making such an intended misleading statement. Pacific Coast people are too well acquainted with the Chinaman to be made believe that our trade with China and Japan can be extended farther than the cheapest and absolute necessities of life. Our boys that soldiered in the Philippines can tell the Oregonian something about the ability of the Asiatic citizen to buy from us—how the common laborer gets \$2.50 to \$3 a month (gold) with the plainest food, principally rice.

Yes, vote for the "Republican ticket June 4" and save our trade with the Chinaman!

THE MERCENARY BRIGADE.

The "mercenary brigade" nominated the Republican tickets for Lane, Douglas and Josephine counties. The land office at Roseburg, aided by the postmasters and other office holders, delivered the goods at the conventions, and it remains to be seen whether this combine will be strong enough to deliver the votes on election to the Mitchell-McBride combine.

The Oregonian inadvertently reprinted a newspaper article scoring the independent candidacy of Fred Merrill, the bicycle man, for representative from Multnomah. The Sunday Oregonian editorially disavowed responsibility for the offensive publication. Mr. Merrill is a heavy advertiser in the Oregonian. That consideration brought an apology where otherwise, probably, Mr. Merrill's protests would have been wasted on air, else thrown into the waste basket. "Business before pleasure."

Now comes the Junction City Times and says the announcement of the fact that J. L. Taylor, Republican candidate for county commissioner, pays only 36 cents tax is a "revolutionary statement," whatever that may mean. The GUARD believes the business sentiment of the voters of Lane county will indorse the GUARD's opposition to Mr. Taylor's candidacy on the first Monday in June.
