COUNTY CLERK LEE'S FINANCIAL JUGGLE.

The Sunday Register takes a half a column of space to convince itself that the Lane county debt is only \$47,956, as juggled by County Clerk Lee in the semi-annual report of March 31. Yet that report showed outstanding warrants, and interest thereon, to the amount of \$114,965.

The Register and County Clerk Lee plan of figuring uncollected taxes as available assets against interest bearing county indebtedness, and making no allowance for the county expenses that will accrue during the period of collection, is a plain juggle with figures that can deceive no one. The plain attempt of County Clerk Lee to hoodwink the public as to the true financial condition of the county, if nothing else, should cause the fair, honest vote of the people of Lane county to be cast for his opponent, Mr. Milliorn.

The Portland Telegram says "Mark Hanna has sent no money to the Republican state committee, but instead has written several letters of encouragement to Chairman Steele." When ducks cease swimming we may believe that Mark Hanna has experienced a change of heart, and now believes in allowing the voters, instead of money, to settle elections. Hanna is the arch-corruptionist of American politics; and what is more he makes no concealment of his methods and purpose. It is straight buy with him.

On the tariff question the Oregonian stands with Democrats and Populists. Here is a good common sense statement from a recent issue of that paper:

"The Oregonian does not advocate free trade, which is an impossibility. It thinks, however, that our infant industries have in most instances outgrown the need of the nursing bottle of protection. Nobody pretends that the tariff does not enhance the cost of wool, yarn, blankets and clothing."

The state tax levy this year is 6.3 mills, the highest, we believe, in the history of Oregon. What is the cause of this high taxation? Has the state built any vast internal improvements? Has it had any extraordinary expense? The answer is no, emphatically no! It is the result of Republican legislation manipulated by bosses who are manipulating affairs for revenue. Do the people want a continuation of these high taxes?—The Dalles Mountaineer.

The Eugene Register is doing business in a county that gave William J. Bryan 377 plurality. Yet it kindly refers to a majority of the voters of Lane county as "fussocrats!" Who does it hurt by the use of the slang epithet? Not the Silver Republicans, Democrats and Populists who have united on common principles against a common political enemy.
