## The Joint Canvass at Lorane.

(GUARD special reporter.)

LORANE, May 19.—The joint canvass at Lorane was another disappointment to the republicans. Lorane has stood about 44 to 27 in favor of the republicans, and they justly expected an ovation in that place. But it was evident from the first that the audience was about equally divided with the enthusiasm clearly in favor of the Citizens' party.

One republican said he came out to hear about county affairs, and others wanted to hear of them, too. Many citizens at Lorane are open to conviction, but they demand an explanation of our high taxes as compared with Linn county. One man, who has been a republican, said that unless the republicans gave some satisfactory explanation on their county court affair, between now and June, Lorane would go for the Citizens' ticket, and that he knew of 8 or 10 voters who had already decided to support the ticket this year. One cannot blame the republican candidates for becoming discouraged; but it is tiresome to see them try to make Lawrence Harris the scape-goat of their misfortunes. A farmer expressed that impression about as follows: "Lawrence is lock, stock, barrel, bung-hole and mouth-piece of the republican party here, but he can't hold his job down." But "Lawrence" is a plucky attorney, for a bad case. A disinterested observer feels like advising him to borrow the fiddler's sign, who was trying to play a cornstalk fiddle for an exasperated crowd; the sign read: "Don't shoot the musician, he is doing the best he can."

Several of the republicans quit the canvass at Cottage Grove. Mr. Hawley is still with the boys however, and his handsome smiling face can be seen everywhere, as he stands like Saul of Tarsus, head and shoulders above the dear people about him. He does not hesitate now to ask even executive committee members from opposing parties to deliver his cards and manage his campaign for him.

Mr. Parker's honest, intelligent countenance is also not lacking. We are told by conservative men that Parker will carry at least 100 republican votes in Cottage Grove. But if Mr. Parker does not quit wearing off the GUARD reporter's overcoat, he may expect trouble in his own ranks.

As to Mr. Gilstrap, when he is out in the farming sections, he makes one think that the herculean vat of bumps and bruises, "flunks" and fizzes, calamities and despairs, had been upset and poured down all over him. It is evident to all who hear him that he and everything else will go to the bow-wow if he is not elected treasurer.

Mr. Milliron is making a silent, clean campaign, as is also Mr. Hill, and both are gaining strength among the better class of voters.

As to the joint canvass at this place, it is only a repetition of other points in the campaign. Mr. Skipworth charged the republicans of corruption in county and state affairs. Mr. Harris replied that he did not think the trusts passed the Porto Rico bill. Mr. Skipworth said that he favored the abolition of the fee system and favored the abolition of the state printer and the letting of all work to the lowest responsible bidder. Mr. Harris replied that prosperity was now so great that men could afford to strike.

Mr. Skipworth pledged himself to support a repeal of the mortgage tax law and the initiative and referendum. Mr. Harris said he was not pledged to anyone for U. S. senator, but believed that the Philippines should have a good and stable government. Mr. Skipworth asked if distance from twenty years of republican state legislation and from those county affairs, did not lend enchantment. Mr. Harris replied that it was both fitting and proper to pass the Gold Standard bill, as it recognized in law what was already true in practice.

Thus, if our tragical county canvass continues it will surely end in a comical farce. But the Citizens say, "let the good work go on."
