PLACES COUNTY CLERK LEE IN FAULT.

The letter of Hon. E. W. Bingham, of Portland, regarding the construction that should be placed upon the duties of the county clerk regarding registration of voters is a very strong indictment of County Clerk Lee. It is unanswerable, and places the Lane county clerk in the discreditable position of having taken advantage of the mere technicality of law to evade performing his duty in registering voters whom he undoubtedly thought were opposed to him politically. No other reason can be assigned for his autocratic disregard of the rights of thirty of his fellow citizens.

Mr. Bingham's opinion should be conclusive to any reasonable man. He is the author of the registration law, and to his efforts, more than any other man, or set of men, may be attributed the enactment of the

law by the legislature. It was discussed for months previous to the meeting of the legislature, and the experience of other states and countries was drawn upon in the effort to secure the passage of a law that would fully protect the ballot from illegal manipulation, while giving the greatest liberty and secrecy to the elector. We give the closing paragraph of his letter: "Section 13, directs the clerk to close his registers at 5 o'clock p. m., of May 15th. He should not register electors applying to him after that hour. But I would allow the preceding sections 5, 9 and 10 to control this provision to the extent above stated. That is, so that the clerk should receive and file and enter all such affidavits, provided they were mailed by the justice or notary 'forthwith'—(say not later than the evening of May 15th) to him, or if they were forwarded in like manner by messenger."

Attorney Kinsey took registrations until 5 o'clock p m May 15th. He presented them to County Clerk Lee May 16th with the request that the names be entered upon the register. County Clerk Lee not only refused to register the names, but went out of his way to insult the messenger.

What answer will the people of Lane county give their autocratic servant Monday June 4th? Is not this instance of his disregard of the rights of his fellow citizens a sufficient reason why he should not be re-elected?

AN INDIAN MEET.

The Umatilla Indians have invited the Nez Perces, of Idaho, to join them in a Fourth of July celebration that will last about a week. If the latter accept the invitation the celebration will be worth going a long way to see. Both tribes are wealthy, have splendid horses, and horse-racing is a passion with the Indian. If he gets down to necessities he will bet his favorite horse, or wife, the latter preferred as life would hardly be worth living without the horse. He could find a wife most any place on the reservation.

The Eastern Oregon and Washington Indian, by the way, bears little resemblance to the depraved fish eating specimen that is seen along the coast, and in the Willamette valley and Puget Sound country. There are many fine specimens of physical manhood among them, while their women are not of the easy type that obtains among the tribes west of the Cascade mountains.
