WHAT THINKS THE VOTER?

The senseless fight made by the GUARD against J. L. Taylor for commissioner because Mr. Taylor is not as heavy a taxpayer as his opponent has been a great vote getter for Mr. Taylor and should insure his election.—Eugene Register.

The "senseless fight made by the GUARD" against Mr. Taylor consists in calling attention to the fact that Mr. Taylor, Republican candidate for county commissioner, pays only 36 cents tax, a special tax of one cent a head on 38 sheep. He pays no property tax. Also that Mr. Hill, the Citizens' nominee, pays \$113 tax. The commissioner to be elected next Monday will assist in disbursing \$250,000 for county purposes during his four years' term of office.

CITIZENS' JUSTICE CANDIDATE

George W. Kinsey is the Union-Citizens' nominee for justice of the peace for the Eugene district. Mr. Kinsey held the office of justice in one of the precincts for a number of years, and his administration was uniformly satisfactory to attorneys, litigants and the people.

In handling criminal examinations, especially, Mr. Kinsey won just commendation. He did not encourage the making of frivolous complaints, and was very careful not to hold an accused person to meet the grand jury in the circuit court unless there was good cause to believe that a conviction could be secured. By conducting the affairs of the office in this manner no small amounts were saved the county in unnecessary cost bills.

A COUNTY WARRANT JOKER?

W. B. Smith of Hale charges County Clerk Lee with delivering county warrants to other persons than the owners without their permission. There is a joker in this. County warrants are worth 1 1/2 per cent premium, and a person gaining possession of a warrant gains the extra premium. He would turn the face value of the warrant, in cash, over to the rightful owner who would lose the premium.

The county clerk has no right to deliver a county warrant to any person except the owner, or on his written order. If Mr. Lee does so it is at his peril.

FOR ASSESSOR.

The GUARD is pleased to learn that the tide is now running strongly in favor of Mr. E. R. Parker for county assessor. It is stated that he will receive 100 Republican votes in Cottage Grove precincts. Mr. Parker is well qualified for the position, and will run the office in an economical manner. On the 14th of June be sure that a cross is marked before his name on your ballot.
