FRIDAY - JULY 13 A FATAL ADMISSION.

The Portland Daily Telegram, the evening edition of the Oregonian, makes the following fatal admission: "That not all the gold democrats of 1896 will vote for Mr McKinley this year is proven by various reports and remarks, and none of these is more significant than the language of ex-Governor Pattison of Pennsylvania, one of the staunchest and boldest of gold-standard democrats, who, in writing to the New York Journal on July 4, said: 'No national convention ever assembled was characterized by more enthusiasm, or associated with more sincerity, than that which met in Kansas City today. If this condition continues, Mr Bryan's election is assured, and the people will have restored to them a government of the people, for the people and by the people. The democratic vote in Pennsylvania will be largely increased, and will contribute to swell the majority of the general vote for Mr Bryan.' When a man like Pattison writes such expressions as this, and a man like 'Dave' Hill gives up and says he is satisfied, it might as well be conceded that at least part of the gold democrats are going to vote for Bryan."

AGENT COWAN'S VERSION.

Portland Mercury: It is reported that the Indian agency at the Warm Springs reservation in Crook county, is to be suspended, and that will let J. L. Cowan out of a job. It was said that there is no longer necessity for an agent, and the affairs of the reservation could be taken care of by the superintendent of school, which would be practically making him an agent, if anything. There are one thousand and more Indians at the reservation, considerably more than at Siletz, Klamath and other agencies, and there is still necessity for retention of an agent at Warm Springs. Mr Cowan alleges that the cause of the attempt to do away the agency is not that no necessity for an agent exists, but that he refused to assist the school supervisor, Conser, in covering up and whitewashing grossly immoral conduct of certain employees of the school. It is not improbable that Mr Cowan will expose the misdeeds of the persons he refers to and

thereby make it tropical for Mr. Conser.

Pendleton E O: The Associated Press informs an anxious public that Hon John Barrett, a few years ago a newspaper reporter in Portland, who arose to prominence through appointment as minister to Siam and his own immaculate gall, has had a conference with the national chairman of the republican party, Hon Mark Hanna, and will take the stump for McKinley and Roosevelt. The republican presidential ticket is to be pitted in its misfortune in attracting the Barrett to its support. John Barrett is a human fly that is forever in search of somebody's molasses and as Mark Hanna has a reputation for having a jug or two of the sweet stuff always on hand John Barrett is buzzing around him, while at the same time keeping the Associated Press well informed of his prominence and importance. The newspapers lend their assistance to great an extent to such self-seeking, political harlots, whose only capital is their knowledge of the uses of publicity through news papers.
